Words from your pastor: We have all probably heard the old English proverb: "April showers bring May flowers." We know that the rainy month of April traditionally gives way to the flowers in bloom in May because of the abundance of water. Metaphorically, the proverb also tells us that a period of discomfort (i.e., rain) can set the stage for a period of happiness and joy. This is true for the Church: The sufferings of Jesus during Holy Week gives way to the joyful worship services during May.



ASCENSION SUNDAY (May 8) – the first on the list of special

Sundays is "Ascension of the Lord:" the 40th day after Easter when Christians remember Jesus went up into heaven with the promises to send the Holy Spirit and Come Again according the Acts 1. The Church has numerous customs to commemorate the day including releasing doves or balloons.

MOTHER'S DAY (MAY 8) — although not a religious holiday, West Side will honor all woman of faith with a special recognition. Woman are encouraged to wear a hat, brooch, or memento your mother or grandmother gave to you!

PENTECOST SUNDAY (MAY 15) – the fiftieth day after Easter which commemorates the giving of the Holy Spirit by God upon Jesus Christ's disciples according to Acts 2. This is the day we celebrate the power of God's Spirit. *Everyone is encouraged to wear RED!*

TRINITY SUNDAY (MAY 22) – the Sunday to celebrate the foundational Christian doctrine of the Trinity: Our God is three Persons in One - the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This Sunday marks the transition between the Easter Season and General Time when the church focuses on Christian growth in character, discipleship, and spiritual disciplines.

MEMORIAL DAY (MAY 29) – although not a religious holiday, we will celebrate this Day to remember all of the Saints of God. *Wear a Flower on Memorial Day* to honor a loved one during



our Memorial Day Worship service on **May 29, 2016.** Men and women are encouraged to wear a rose, carnation or other flower to remember a loved one. Wear a live, silk, plastic, or metal flower:

- a. **BLUE** flower to remember a father or grandfather
- b. **FORGET-ME-NOT** flower to honor a fallen comrade
- c. **RED** flower to honor a military veteran
- d. **WHITE** flower to remember a spouse or loved one
- e. **YELLOW** flower to remember a mother or grandmother

FINANCE REPORT- For the first three months (1/4) of the year, we have received \$450.54 more than what we spent. Our income is \$67,002.22 or 25.5% of what we budgeted. This compares to \$58,620.87 in 2015.

Our expenses to date are: \$66,564.64 or 25.3% of the budget. This compares to \$59,193.07 in 2015.

In receipts for March, there is nothing out of the ordinary to report. In expenditures, we have a number of line items that are more than 50% spent with only 25% of the year gone. Members of the church council will be keeping a watchful eye on some of those.

We have \$7,869.00 in the checking account at the end of March which includes an \$8,000 loan from the capital campaign to help with cash flow. I mentioned last month that we were getting close in needing to transfer some money from our investments to maintain a good cash flow. Borrowing from the capital campaign was a quick fix to pay the end of the month bills. We will pay the capital campaign back when the cash is available or when we make a transfer from our investments.

BIBLE BOOK OF THE MONTH-

Nahum's world and the world of Judah, was dominated by Assyria which embodied terror and extreme human evil. Incarceration and cruelty to humans knew no bounds. Nahum's, as was Jonah's, main focus is on Nineveh, the seat of Assyrian power. The Assyria of Nahum's time had left its repentance of Jonah's time far behind.

Nahum, whose name means "comfort", was a poet of considerable ability and originality who gifted us with a work of literary excellence and style. Nahum saw God as a universal God whose extended over all nations. power Nahum raised the question, "Should Assyria go unpunished?" And he answered with an emphatic, "no". This book spoke of faith in a time of faltering faith. As you read of the evil of Assyria, look for the golden threads of hope woven in. As a contrast, you may want to read Jonah. Thank-you for joining American Baptist Women in reading the Bible Book of the Month and letting God speak to you as you read.
