"Giving Makes Us Happy"

Words from your pastor: Rexanne and I enjoy giving our money to God through our local church and national denomination! Giving ten-percent (a tithe), and sometimes more, of our hard-earned resources to God through our local church makes us happy. We like to see God use the money we donate to empower Christian educators, to feed hungry children, to provide for our missionaries, to fund our youth group, and to maintain the building and grounds as a mission center for God's work in the neighborhood. Our family does not give because we should give. We give a percentage of our income as an appropriate faith commitment for which God's grace empowers us. We know that God calls us to be faithful managers of all that God gives us so that God can use our gifts to transform us spiritually, to move us towards maturity, and to extend Christ's transforming love to our neighbors and world.

Since we obey God's leading, we do not worry that we will lack enough money to pay our bills, to take a vacation, or to maintain our home. We budget, plan, save, sacrifice, and give because we have an internal need to give. Rexanne and I want to be active participants in God's missionary work in and for the world.

It has taken years of encouragement and financial diligence to develop into spiritually mature believers who generously give a percentage of our income. As church research expert, George Barna, states, "People do not drift into good giving habits. They decide into them." Christians grow spiritually into practices of generosity because they ask the essential question: "What percentage of your income do you feel God is calling you to give through my local church?" And then, they give!

Consecration Sunday is coming! This is not an annual fund-raising campaign. No one will come to your home to ask you for money or a pledge. The leaders of your church are asking you to give so we can serve in Jesus' name. We want you to grow



spiritually so you can give joyfully – as Paul wrote, "God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7).

Giving makes us happy. I hope you will discover the joy of giving, too.

CONSECRATION SUNDAY IS **COMING -** Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely to

pay its bills. Rather, such congregations financial contributions to see help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their income.

Our congregation's committee selected has the Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based the biblical on philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the "What percentage of my question, income is God calling me to give?" morning During worship Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make

their financial commitments our church's missionary, benevolent, educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an Estimate of Giving Card does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend even if they feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that one feels personal no embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During mornina ecration worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and climaxed inspiration, by members making their commitments as а confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and governing board members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend the Consecration Sunday worship.

CHURCH FINANCES - This is a



general overview of our church finances through the end of September.

- We are at 75% of the budget year –
 3/4 of the year is behind us!
- For September, our income to date is: \$182,293.42 or 69.4% of our budget. This is \$16,418.33 under what was budgeted for the first three quarters of the year. Last month we were at \$165,512.71 or 63.02% of our budget which was \$9,574.45 under what was budgeted.
- Our expenses to date are: \$197,847.32 or 75.33% of our budget. This is \$95.83 over what was budgeted for the first three quarters of the year. Last month we were \$174,101.94 or 66.29% of our budget which was \$985.22 under what was budgeted.
- We have spent \$15,553.90 more than receipts at the end of the third quarter. This compares to \$8,589.23 more than receipts last month.
- The checking account at the end of September was \$1,860.33. At the end of August, it was \$4,970.56. We

still have a \$7,500 outstanding loan from the capital campaign account to assist us with cash flow. By borrowing from the capital campaign, it allows us not to withdraw from our investments at this time. (Note: We paid back \$2,500 of the loan from the capital campaign in early October.)




