"The Work of God...Morning and Evening"

Words from your pastor: Thank you to our leaders and members for allowing me to join the *Benedictine Spirituality Immersion* class at Conception Abbey first week of January with Dr. Molly T. Marshall. As students, we joined the Benedictine monks in their daily prayer exercises which their fifth-century founder, St. Benedict of Nursia, called "The Work of God." We recited the Psalms and scriptures, mediated on scripture (*lectio Divina*), offered intercessory prayers five times a day, and kept



silence. One might wonder, "what could a Baptist learn from hanging out with Roman Catholic monks?" A lot!

First and foremost, the time reminded me that God created us to be *spiritual* persons. Everyone needs time to focus (and refocus) their lives on the spiritual practices which help nurture their life in Christ. Over time, clergy – as well as laity – are prone to fall into the sin the dessert fathers and mothers called *acedia* or *accidie* – the "devil of the noonday sun." Simply put, it is spiritual boredom. Our daily routines cause us to grow indifferent to religious matters, to focus on tasks which are not important, and slip into destructive patterns of behavior. A spiritual retreat gave me time and space to refocus on Christ.

Second, a retreat helped me recalibrate my priorities at work. St. Benedict wrote a book of precepts (Rules) which would guide the monks living in community. Most of the rules are practical guidelines for admitting new monks, administrative tasks, community discipline, and daily tasks. Some of the rules are spiritual guideposts, such as rule 72:11: "Prefer nothing whatever to Christ." Benedict told his students the most important task for Christians is scripture reading and intercessory prayer, which he called "The Work of God." Our chores and daily labors support our primary work: prayer! The monks were to place a high priority on their prayer times ("The Daily Office). All other tasks – including eating and sleeping – were secondary to the primary work: adoration and intercession. The Protestant Reformation in England shortened the expectations for working Christians to "Morning and Evening."

Finally, the retreat reminded me of the universality of Christ's Church. Christians can and should learn with and from one another. Ecumenism - our shared encounters and common work – is important. As the church, we can pray for and with one another for the transformation of the world. If you get a chance next year, consider joining Dr. Marshall at Conception Abbey! Spiritual blessings,

TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE The Technology Committee is under the Coordinator of Administration and has been

doina busv upgrades over the past several months at West Side Baptist Church. This article is to update vou on the details



of these upgrades. We have set up wireless access points around the church that you can use if you have a Bible on your iPad,

Kindle, or other electronic reader. There are access points located in the Youth Room, the sanctuary, and Holmer Hall. If you are attending a Bible study in Holmer Hall, look for wsbcguest-2. In the sanctuary, you can look for wsbc-guest. If you are in the lower level, look for wsbc youth room. You can connect to all these networks by using the password posted around the church. If you are on the second floor and needing wireless access, you should be able to see wsbcguest-2. A projector has been installed in Holmer Hall that has connections for laptop computers and other electronic devices for meetings and for Sunday School. This also opens possibilities of connecting to ABC missionaries in the field, attending ABC and ABCCR events remotely if the option is available, and other possibilities that you may have. 2016 TREASURER'S REPORT - Our total



income for 2016 was \$288,313.24 which included \$36,148 from our investments -\$30,000 for operating expenses, \$4,920 memorials, and

\$1,228.38 from the Ruby Edwards fund used for youth expenditures. Our total expenses for the year were \$263,893.25. Our Net Operating Income was \$24,419.99 with \$3,910.03 Net Income after Other Income and Expenses.

Our checking account at the end of December was \$23,316.07. Out of this cash, we have \$12,026.17 that came in during November and December earmarked for the roof and boiler repairs. 2017 roof repairs are estimated at \$16,400 and boiler repairs/replacement at \$7,900. It was approved at the October 2016 church business meeting that we should ask people to give in addition to their tithe to these needed repairs and what was not raised would be paid out of the capital campaign money market account. We are about halfway to our goal.

Several times throughout the year we borrowed from our capital campaign to help with cash flow in our checking account. All of that money has been returned to the capital campaign account.
