"Are You Serious about Your Spiritual Life?"

Words from your pastor: Are you serious about your spiritual life? Are you a fully devoted follower of Jesus Christ? Are you dedicated to personal growth and spiritual maturity? These are the questions of Lent – the forty-day religious journey from Ash Wednesday (the ritual marking the start of a season for repentance) through Holy Saturday (a day of fasting prior to

Easter). The Lenten season is a time when many Christians intentionally start or renew a spiritual discipline or practice to show they're earnestly devoted to following Jesus Christ and his life of sacrificial service. The aim is to set aside time with God for personal reflection on the life, death, burial, and resurrection of our Messiah to help prepare us for the joyful celebration of the Easter Resurrection.

Thomas Merton, O.C.S.O., an American Catholic mystic and Trappist monk of the Abbey of Gethsemani, Kentucky, once wrote, "A life is either all spiritual or not spiritual at all. No man can serve two masters. Your life is shaped by the end you live for. You are made in the image of what you desire." Lent is the season to ask: What is my ultimate desire? Am I on the right path? How can I shape my daily life to reach heaven's goal?

Many Christians return to the spiritual-disciplines of our past:

- Fasting abstaining from a food or physical pleasure as an act of self-control/denial
- Moderation bringing life, rest, and work back into a healthier balance
- Prayer rededicating oneself to the daily ritual of morning and evening prayers
- Sacrifice giving up something of importance to spend time with God



As we approach the Holy Season of the Resurrection, join me as we rededicate ourselves to being serious about discipleship and spiritual disciplines! Join me on our Lenten journey: *Seriously*!

OUR CHURCH FINANCES -

This is a general overview of our church finances through the end of January.



- We start 2017 with our first month's income of \$26,930.06. This includes our annual distribution or \$7,589.00 from our investment at the Topeka Community Foundation. The expenses for January were \$21,103.62. Our net income for the month was \$5,826.45.
- Our checking account at the end of January was \$29,182.71. Out of this cash, we have \$12,026.17 that came in during November and December earmarked for the roof and boiler repairs. In January we had an additional \$1,974.00 come in for a total of \$14,000.17. Roof repairs are estimated at \$16,400 and boiler repairs/replacement at \$7,900. It was approved at the October 2016

church business meeting that we ask people to give in addition to their tithe to these needed repairs and what was not raised would be paid out of the capital campaign money market account. We have almost 60% of what is needed. We will continue to collect for these expenses throughout 2017.

over the past several months at West Side Baptist Church. This article is to update you on the details of these upgrades. We have set up wireless access points around the church that you can use if you have a Bible on your iPad, Kindle, or other electronic reader. There are access points located in the Youth Room, the sanctuary, and Holmer Hall. If you are attending a Bible study in Holmer Hall, look for wsbcguest-2. In the sanctuary, you can look for wsbc-guest. If you are in the lower level, look for wsbc youth room. You can connect to all these networks by using the password posted around the church. If you are on the second floor and needing wireless access, you should be able to see wsbcquest-2. A projector has been installed in Holmer Hall that has connections for laptop computers and other electronic devices for meetings and for Sunday School. This also opens possibilities of connecting to ABC missionaries in the field, attending ABC and ABCCR events remotely if the option is available, and other possibilities that you may have. 
our mission work, and camping opportunities just to name a few. I'm excited to see what God has planned for us in 2017 and beyond!
