### "We are Here Because We Care!"

Paul's letters remind us that as members of the church, we are so closely connected that we can think of ourselves as parts of one body. The New Testament constantly refers to followers of Jesus, not as Christians, but as a family — brothers and sisters. We live this out when someone is ill, mourning, or facing a crisis. We show up. We are there for our loved ones in need. We show that love in tangible ways, with casseroles and cards, with hugs and spoken words of prayer. These acts let our brothers and sisters in Christ know that we are present with them.



let our brothers and sisters in Christ know that we are present with them. They know they are not alone because we are beside them. When someone we love suffers — all our truest words and most loving actions simply declare: "I am here."

The Bible tells us that we are like God in this respect. When one of God's beloved children suffers, God declares, "I am here." God hears the cries of the poor and oppressed (Exodus 3:9, Psalm 10:17, 69:33), is near to the brokenhearted (Psalm 34:18), and is near to all who call God's name (Psalm 145:18). The promise that God will be with us is a constant refrain from Genesis to Revelation.

When we see the latest tragedy on the news, we might ask, "Where are you, God?" But we already know the answer: God is here in the midst of those who are hurting. God is with us, Immanuel!

When Jesus tells the parable of the sheep and the goats (Matthew 25:31-40), he reveals to us a mystery. God is most tangibly present in the world where people hunger, thirst, lack adequate clothing, need shelter, and are sick or imprisoned. Christ claims as family members people who suffer. Christ is so present in them that when we feed the hungry, care for the sick, welcome the stranger — we feed and care for...and welcome Jesus Christ, as if he were physically present.

This command to love one another applies not just to your fellow Christians but anyone in need, anywhere in the world. All people are our sisters, our brothers, our children, our family because all people belong to the family of God. Their needs might seem different than the person we worship with on Sunday but our tangible gifts declare the same message: "I am here." By reaching out to those who suffer from natural disasters, war, or systemic poverty, we let them know that they are not forgotten. Even when the need seems far from here, by acting together as the body of Christ, we are able to be there for these members of Christ's family.

We show God's children love with gifts of rice and oil. We are present by providing well pumps for clean water, seeds for sustainable agriculture, and teachers to build skills and share knowledge for self-sustaining work. Through medical kits, school supplies, temporary shelters, and safe housing we show up: "We are here!" This is why our world relief and development offering - the One Great Hour of Sharing - is so important. Whenever we send our money, where ever we sent our missionaries, whenever we respond to natural and human-made disaster through compassion and care, we declare: "We are here!" In Bangladesh, Burundi, Chile, China, Colombia, Cuba, India, Indonesia, Kenya, Lebanon, Liberia, Ohio, Myanmar, Micarague, New York, Philippines, Rhode Island, Thailand, Togo, Vermont, West Virginia, and everywhere there is an emergency. In the midst

of suffering, where is God? God is here. Where are you? When you give to OGHS, you say, "We are here because we care!"


#### INTERNATIONAL MINISTRIES—

The Hear the Call weekend retreat is a high intensity three-day experience hosted by International Ministries (IM) for anyone considering a call to global mission. In the past six years, dozens of people have participated and 11 so far have gone on to global mission service. The retreat will be held on August 18-20, 2017, at the Green Lake Conference Center in Green Lake, Wisconsin.Registration is now open.

Registration for the event is \$80. Housing is \$255 for couples and \$127.50 for single individuals. Meals for the entire weekend are \$93.25 per person (plus tax). ## Our Church Finances –





This is a general overview of our church finances through the first four months of 2017.

Income through April is \$84,907.15 or 32.23% of the budget. The expenses for the same months total \$104,294.19 or 39.59%. Our net income to date is: -\$19,387.04. Our budget is over-expended due to the boiler and roof repairs during the first quarter of the year.

The money in the checking account at the end of April was \$5,796.84 with several outstanding bills including the masonry repairs to be paid. (UPDATE: In order to have a good cash flow, \$6,000 was withdrawn on May 12<sup>th</sup> from our Wells Fargo investments. is This the first withdrawal of the year.)

An additional \$125 came in during the month of April to offset the \$15,915.33 expenses for the boiler and roof repairs. The money raised for these repairs approved by the council but not budgeted is \$14,512.17. We have not received the invoice for the masonry work that is being done. (UPDATE: The first masonry Invoice for \$3,000 was paid on May 16, 2017 and more work is being done.) Additional gifts for these projects are still needed and would be appreciated.
