OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for June is \$18,351.84 and to date totals \$131,885.48 or 48.33% of our annual budget. Our expenses for June is 19,694.89 and to date total \$137,898.46 or 50.53% of our budget. Therefore, our net income for the first six months of the year is -\$6,012.98.

We have \$22,515.47 in our checking account at the end of May which includes \$4,116.20 in the Youth Fund and \$913.07 in the Baby Closet Fund. The large balance in the checking account which has helped us with cash flow this summer is mainly due to the additional gifts made for the sign/boiler campaign

I'd like to give you an update on the campaign. We need to raise \$47,565 to pay for the new sign (\$4,650) and the upcoming repairs to the boiler (\$42,915). In May we received a number of additional gifts and pledges bringing our total received to \$18,855.07.

We have raised 39.6% of our goal! I don't have a pledge total to give at this writing. To all of you who have been able to make one or more additional gifts, thank you!

If you did not get a pledge form or misplaced yours, another copy is available on the table outside the church office. With prayerful consideration I ask you to complete the form and return it in the offering plate or to the church office along with your gift. The pledge can be made over a one, two or even three year period and should be in addition to your regular tithe. We have a couple more months before the boiler repairs will be made.

I want to thank Jim Lagerberg for joining me in a meeting last week with our church financial advisor at Wells Fargo, Chris McGee. We reviewed how our \$225,000 investment at Wells Fargo has been doing and discussed if we wanted/needed to make any change. We decided not to make any changes. We did decide to move \$15,000 into cash in preparation of the shortage in the general fund once the boiler expenses are paid. It will be the capital campaign money market fund that will be used to pay for the balance of the boiler after we take out of the general fund the additional gifts that have been made throughout these few months.
