The Harvesters Food Program has been a tremendous blessing, not only for the people who come for the food give-away, but for enabling us to serve nutritious, low-cost meals each week. We are blessed with people who cook, serve, and clean up every week. Also thanks to the ones who pick up all that food, bring it back to the church, carry, set up and distribute it. Their service is much appreciated. After supper the kids, youth, and adults head off to their classes. The Bible Study topic for this semester is from the Book of Acts and is entitled "The Church on Mission". We have loved introducing the kids to the Holy Spirit and soon to learning about Paul's journeys. We have so many children that are "unchurched" and hearing these stories for the first time. We are blessed with dedicated teachers who faithfully share with these kids, not only the Bible stories, but also God's love. They are much appreciated. Also to successfully run our program we use many other adult volunteers. We have some to drive and chaperone in the van so that people without transportation can safely get here and home again. We have a "Bible Bucks Store", where kids can spend their "Bible Buck" rewards they've earned for attendance and making good behavior choices. We have registration and attendance forms to be filled out every week. We have a game coordinator who plans recreational activities. It also takes people who are willing to substitute in these roles when our regulars are gone. THANK YOU to all who have stepped up to help. You are a blessing to us and make this program possible. To everyone in the congregation, I want to invite you to come some Wednesday night and just see your church at work. It is a busy, bustling place, sometimes seeming noisy or confusing, but God is working here. He has blessed us by giving us the means, the people, and the property in this neighborhood to spread His Good News.

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

The budget year is 2/3's of the way over. Our income for August is \$23,113.31 and for the year totals \$186,872.39 or 68.48% of our annual income budget. The



includes \$20,210.07 in our fundraising efforts for the sign and boiler repair.

Our expenses for August are \$26,733.76 and for the year totals \$187,724.29 or 68.79% of our budget.

We have \$15,493.51 in our checking account at the end of August. This includes \$2,017.88 in the Youth Fund and \$155.11 in the Baby Closet Fund and the money from our fundraising efforts for the new sign and boiler repair.

Please continue to help us in our fundraising efforts for the boiler and new sign. We are almost half-way to our goal of raising the \$47,565 needed. What is not raised will need to be taken from our capital campaign fund's money market. We recently voted as a church to also pay out of the capital campaign fund's money market for the stone masonry work needed on the front of the church. This is an additional \$2,500+. We won't have much left in this fund if more doesn't come in from our fundraising efforts. Thank you. The van repair of \$2,120 was made in August as well as

the insurance reimbursement of \$1,620.02. Also, if you review the finance report posted on the church bulletin board you will note that we had three pay periods fall in August.
