LIGHT DISPELS THE DARKNESS!

Pastor's Corner - The Woolly Bear banded caterpillars wiggling across the roads were right: winter is on its way! Cooler weather has come to our area a little earlier than I expected. I hope the Farmers Almanac is wrong: its suppose to be a "teethchattering cold winter" with a higher than average amount of precipitation: SNOW!

The cold weather also signals a change in the hours of daylight vs darkness. We will see the slow increase of darkness (shorter days) until the Winter Solace, and then the sun will slowly climb higher into the atmosphere. Many of the living world religions will celebrate this change with "light ceremonies":

• **Diwali** - On November 7, Hindu, Jain, Buddhist, and Sikh worshippers will begin Diwali - a five-day



autumn festival in the northern hemisphere when revelers will light clay lamps to signal the triumph of light over dark, liberation, and their New Year.

• Samhain (Halloween) - A Gaelic feast when Celts light candles on October 31 to mark the end of the harvest and the start of the "dark half" of the year.

- Yule On Friday, December 21, Neopagans will start their week-long observance of Yule - a Germanic feast marking the death and rebirth of the sun. Worshippers will burn traditional Yule logs and light bonfires to help the dying sun.
- Advent/Christmas As Christians, we will start our celebration of Advent and Christmas with a "Christ the King Sunday" service on November 25. This service declares Christ has not only conquer death but darkness, evil, and all forces in the universe. It is the last Sunday of the Church year (acknowledging Christ if the *Alpha* and *Omega*, beginning and end).

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

The budget year is 3/4's or 75% over. Our income for September was \$15,075.95 and totals for the year \$201,970.31 or 74.01% of our annual budget. The income includes \$20,460.07 in our fundraising efforts for the sign and boiler repair. We are almost half-way to our goal of \$42,915.



- Our expenses for September are \$17,199.18 and total to date \$205,258.29 or 75.22% of our budget.
- We had \$13,995.22 in our checking account at the end of September. This included \$2,017.88 in the Youth Fund and \$31.69 in the Baby Closet Fund. The remainder of the checking account is the money collected for the boiler replacement/repairs.
- Our fundraising efforts for the boiler will continue until at least the end of the year. It is projected that we will pay McElroy's for the boiler replacement and repairs in November and will be paid from the fundraising dollars collected with remainder out of the capital campaign fund's money market. That will just about use up all the capital campaign fund.
- The council members have been working on their program budgets for 2019. We will have a budget to present to the church along with asking you to help us decide on our level of mission giving and salary increases.

TRM Ministries relies on donations of food from individuals, churches, and other businesses partnering agencies to meet the daily food needs of our guests. Our most pressing food needs are updated monthly on our website. Thank you for your support. Because of your generous and loyal support, and your donations of money, food and time, every \$5 donated serves a fresh meal to 35 people.

24,000 Meals Per Month:

TRM Ministries Food Services is responsible for the planning, on preparing and serving average 24,000 meals per month TOPEKA RESCUE MISSION



in our dining room 7 days a week. The food served consists primarily of food donations from the community. Because of the generosity of the friends of TRM, this is accomplished for a cost of only 14 cents per meal.

Anyone who is hungry is welcome to eat at TRM.

450 Sack Lunches Weekly

For those TRM guests who are unable to be present during meal times, sack lunches are provided by written request. Sack lunches are also kept on hand to feed others who come in who have a need. Meeting this need requires making 1,200 sandwiches per week. A typical sack lunch includes 2 lunchmeat sandwiches (with cheese when available), chips, fruit or a fruit cup, a granola bar and a dessert. Supplies needed include 120 loaves of bread and approximately 300 lbs of lunch meat each week.
