God's Global Servants











HOW TO SUPPORT A GLOBAL SERVANT: We have fallen for a disaster lie! The devil has convinced the church in North America that our job as "Mission Senders" is simply to give missionaries our money and prayers, and then wait for their newsletters. This mindset disconnects us from the real work God is doing in the world, and our role as partners in God's global mission.

There are **SEVEN** action steps you can take to be a great mission sender for God's global servants (i.e., missionaries) in the world:

- 1.LEARN Who are your missionaries? What are they doing? What nation or ethnic group are they trying to serve? How long have they been serving? What unreached people groups still need to hear the Gospel in their country of service? What is an unreached people group? There is a plethora of information to learn about our missionaries and God's work. Where can you find information about your global servants?
- 2.**PRAY** The church is called to pray for and with our missionaries. Many of them send prayer requests via email with regular updates. Pray for God's global servants. Ask God to give boldness and open doors. Pray for the people who need to hear the call of God
- 3.**SEND -** Send them personal letters and emails. Send them birthday cards!
- 4.**GO!** Go visit them! Yes! Go visit your missionaries on a Short-Term Mission trip. There are discovery trips (no labor) and work trips. Attend the World Mission Conference.
- 5.**GIVE** Donate your time, talent, and treasurers. Give a reoccurring, monthly financial gift PLUS give to the World Mission Offering.
- 6. **MOBILIZE** Roll bandages, gather supplies, host a Tea, get involved with White Cross.
- 7. **WELCOME** There is nothing that says, "I love you" and "I missed you" more than being greeted at the airport by family and friends. Welcome missionaries in your home!

Over the next several months, I will share with you practical steps you can take to help support God's global servants in the world.



TREASURER'S REPORT OUR - CHURCH



Expenses for March totaled \$28,474.32. To date we have spent 33.95% of the budget. Our net income for the year is \$10,224.23 which includes a \$20,000 transfer from our investments which I informed you about last

month.

Our checking account at the end of March was \$31,675.47 which included the investment transfer along with \$3,899.65 in the Youth Fund, \$32.07 in the Baby Closet Fund and \$594.50 in the Major Building Repairs gifts.

If you recall, we decided to spend \$2,000 from memorial funds of Barbara Edds for the kitchen counter top project. The new counter tops were installed and they look great! The bill was paid in March. This \$2,000 transfer from investments was made along with an additional \$18,000 from our Wells Fargo investment fund to assist in cash flow as well as repay the \$7,000 we owed the Capital Campaign when we were repairing the boilers. The \$7,000 will be paid back later in April.

Thank you for your continued gifts to our building repairs fund. This is important! These gifts are being used for the costs of the boiler repairs.

REQUIRED: Clients must bring a recent piece of US Mail with the client's NAME and CURRENT ADDRESS as proof-of-residency. **INCOME GUIDELINES**: None.

HOUSEHOLDS: One household per address. **BAGS**: Clients are encouraged to bring reusable grocery bags. **HANDICAPPED ACCESSIBLE**: The building is

handicapped accessible with ramps and elevator. **PARKING:** Park on the north side of the church, enter north-west doors. Call the Church Office at (785) 233-4241 for weather-related closures or more information. *All food is available at no cost.

April Pantry Report: Individuals (369 adults, 304 children, and 68 seniors) in 207 families were able to receive free bread, fruits, vegetables, and other items (total 4,305 pounds) from the Food Pantry during November 2018.

Year-to-Date Pantry Report: 7,768 individuals (3,745 adults; 3,700 children plus 677 Seniors) received 32,666 lbs.

Worship is the primary work of all Christians.



(May 8) – the first on the list of special Sundays is "Ascension of the Lord:" the 40th day after Easter when Christ's followers remember He went up into heaven with the promises to send the Holy Spirit and Come Again (Acts 1). The Church has numerous customs to commemorate the day including releasing doves or balloons.

- Mother's Day (May 8) A civic day but we will honor all woman of faith with a special recognition. Woman are encouraged to wear a hat, scarf or a memento from their mother or grandmother! Yellow is the traditional color for the day.
- ◆ Pentecost Sunday (May 15) the fiftieth day after Easter when we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church (Acts 2). Everyone is encouraged to wear red!
- Trinity Sunday (May 22) This day we celebrate the doctrine of the Trinity: God


 the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. This Sunday marks the transition between the Easter Season and General Time when the church focuses on spiritual growth in character, discipleship, and spiritual disciplines.
- ♦ Memorial Day (May 29) A civic holiday, we will celebrate this Day to remember all of the Saints of God. Wear a Flower on Memorial Day to honor a loved one during our Memorial Day Worship service on May 29, 2016. Men and women are encouraged to wear a rose, carnation or other flower to remember a loved one. Wear a live, silk, plastic, or metal flower:
 - BLUE flower to remember a father or grandfather
 - FORGET-ME-NOT flower to honor a fallen comrade
 - RED flower to honor a military veteran
 - WHITE flower to remember a spouse
 - YELLOW flower to remember a mother or grandmother.

These special services will help us not only connect with God but move us from the ordinary to the extraordinary days of summer. It's time to celebration - Join us!
