

# "IN THE BLEAK MID-WINTER"

**Pastor's Corner** - The well-known Anglo-Italian writer, Christina Rossetti, did not intend her poem, "A Christmas Carol," to become the famous Christmas hymn, "In the Bleak Mid-Winter." Originally written for publication in her book of poetry, the text gained greatest notoriety when it was published in *The English Hymnal* (1906) with church musician, Gustav Holst (1874-1934), unique tune composed specifically for the text.

Historians generally agree Rossetti most likely wrote the words to express her melancholy one dark, cold night:

In the bleak midwinter, frosty wind made moan, Earth stood hard as iron, water like a stone; Snow had fallen, snow on snow, snow on snow, In the bleak midwinter, long ago.

However, if one reads past the first stanza, the song reveals a deep faith and knowledge of God. She describes Christ's incarnation (i.e., nativity), the Second Coming, and more importantly of all, Christ's Lordship over all humankind. What started as a groan from a downcast spirit deep in darkness moves to wonderful expression of faith and assurance of God's presence.

The final verses express her reaction to Jesus's coming:

What can I give Him, poor as I am?
If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb;
If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part;
Yet what I can I give Him: give my heart.

This Advent and Christmas season, we will sing many of our favorites (and less favorite) carols. Most of our holiday hymns were written first as poems which were set to music during a dark time of year: winter. These songs reinforce our faith that Christmas is about *God coming in Jesus!* What can you give him?

Give him your heart!



## **OUR CHURCH FINANCES - October 2019**

- We are at 83.3 % of our budget year.
- The income for October was \$23,000.90 and to date totals \$233,086.34 or 87.03% of the year. This income includes a recent transfer of \$5,000 from our Wells Fargo investments. The total from these investments this year is \$25,000. Out of this \$25,000 there was \$11,050 in interest and the remainder from principle. This amount does not include the annual distribution from the Topeka Community Foundation.
- Our expenses for October totaled \$19,598.83 and to date totals \$244,194.09 or 91.18%. The main reason the expenses are so great is due to major building repairs. Our newest building expense is replacing the stool in the family restroom. The new long-range capital campaign committee will be holding its first meeting soon to discuss plans for 2020 and beyond so we can handle future major repairs for our church facility.
- Our net income for the year is \$-11,107.74 compared to -25,764.30 last month. Our checking account at the end of October was \$8,893.91. This includes \$3,502.31 Youth Fund, \$1,000 Outreach grant, \$1,500 Baby Closet grant, \$3,100 Major Building Repairs gifts, \$500 WWW grant and \$100 Capital Funds Campaign.

By the time you read this newsletter the 2020 Proposed Budget will have been presented at the Stewardship luncheon. The new budget includes a request from the Pastor Relations Committee on the pastor's salary package as well as a 2% salary increase for staff recommended by the Personnel Committee and approved by the Church Council.

**DOORSTEP -** This year has presented many challenges for Doorstep, and thankfully many blessings. As you have heard, with the sewer issue in our basement in late August we lost at least 1/3 of the Christmas items we had stored. We have cleaned up and organized the donations and have a good idea what we really need for the Christmas Store, which isn't far away now! The Christmas Store is the week of December 8<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup>!

# Items we really need are:

New, winter clothing youth, boys & girls, sizes 6-16, teens, women and men.

Women like the sweat sets, pajama pants & tops & long nightgowns. The men can use sweat sets, long sleeved shirts & boxer briefs (all sizes). All children receive an outfit and a set of pajamas. The youth section, sizes 6-16, is the largest age range we help, and we always have to buy clothing in these sizes to cover the children we have adopted.

We also need toys for all children, and gifts for teenagers. And, monetary gifts to help cover the food expenses of the Christmas Store, which is the largest expense.

We need volunteers to work each day starting on Sunday, December 8<sup>th</sup> from 2pm- 5pm to help move all collected items to First Nazarene Church across the street. Monday volunteers are needed to help sort and organize donations. Then on Wednesday the 11<sup>th</sup> and Thursday the 12<sup>th</sup> we need volunteers to escort

the families around as they shop. Flyers have been distributed with the dates and times. We schedule 19 households per hour during distribution, so we need plenty of volunteer escorts!

You can bring donations for the Doorstep Christmas Store, Monday – Friday from 8am – 3pm. We are located at 1119 SW 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue (10<sup>th</sup> and Buchanan), or to your congregation. Donated items for the Store are needed by Monday, December 9<sup>th</sup> at the very latest!







