

THE CHURCH SCATTERED AND GATHERED

"On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout Judea and Samaria" (Acts 8:1)

Pastor's Corner - Life in the first-century church was anything but easy! Most people spent their time and energy simply trying to survive the rigors of daily chores, constant disease, famines, plagues, and Roman occupation. Followers of The Way (i.e., Christianity or the Jesus' Movement) carried with them an additional array of consequences, such as alienation, banishment, discrimination, expulsion from the houses of worship, persecution, imprisonment, and even death. Everyday people of the early church accepted the risks. Some of them perished but many of them flourished during times of uncertainty.

Few, if any, would have said, "God caused the hostilities, threats, and ill-treatment," since God does not tempt us (James 1:13). God did use the calamities and catastrophes to His advantage (Romans 8:28). The first persecutions drove God's people from the security of their homes and houses of worship in Jerusalem "throughout Judea and Samaria;" (Acts. 8:1), from the Temple and Holy City to evangelize visitors from Africa (Ethiopian Eunuch, Acts. 8:26-40), from the shores of Galilee to "as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, spreading the word only among Jews" (Acts 11:19), and eventually, to the ends of the earth. God moved in each emergency to advance the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and His people.

Today, some believers are concerned about the life of the Church post-pandemic (after all of this is over). There is a concern that closing church buildings for six weeks or more has caused irreversible harm to the church institution. You have probably read the predictions: small churches will close, large churches will go bankrupt, and people will get into the habit of "skipping" church. Throughout history, there have been doomsday predictions about the sustainability of God's people. Sadly, there are times when local churches close. Despite these prognostications, the Good News is more churches are thriving during this pandemic.

A recent poll showed that prior to the pandemic, only 10% of the churches were growing but now 48% of churches in the US are reaching new audiences. This shows the fundamental truth, the church is sustained by the Spirit of Jesus Christ, not by its members or money. The Spirit that raised Jesus Christ from the dead is the same Spirit which gives life and vitality to believers AND Christ's church on earth.

Church leaders have learned several lifechanging lessons: (1) the People of God do not need a building to be the Church, (2) the primary work of the church is prayer, preaching/teaching, praise (or worship), and serving persons in need; (3) members and nonmembers want online options with exceptional audio and high-quality video, (4) non-churchgoers are very grateful and open to the Gospel because of our simple acts of kindness (i.e., charity); (5) members want to give electronically, (6) nonmembers want to worship according to their preferred time of service, style of music, quality of teaching, and outstanding programs; and (7) people desire flexibility and choice!

What will the church look like in a postpandemic world? We do not know. As our nation switches from response to recovery (i.e., opening back up), the Church must begin to talk about "What will church look like after the Coronavirus (COVID 19) pandemic"? There are many blogs, resources, and websites asking this important question, such as /www.vanderbloemen.com/ blog/reopening-the-church-after-covid19. As we being to dream about gathering again - while maintaining good hygiene and the health code what do you pray is God's vision for our congregation? What ministries and programs does God want us to restart? What ministries or programs will not restart? What, if anything, will go back to normal? What will become the "new normal"? I think we can all agree, life will not be the same again, but God can and will use this crisis to bring people to faith and advance the cause of Christ! ~ Blessings, Pastor Ivan



OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for the year is \$66,930.31. March income was \$13,888.75. Our expenses for the year total \$68,196.03. March was the largest month of expenses to date with \$28,313.03. Our insurance payment of \$9,308 and our renewal of the CCLI/ CVLI Licenses of \$331.00



were due in March resulting in higher expenses for the month. Our net income to date is -\$1,265.72.

Our offerings on Easter totaled \$4,722 with an additional \$300 from our online giving. \$430 was specifically earmarked for the special Easter offering. As I write this newsletter article I can report that we have more Easter offerings still coming in. I'll give an overview later.

At the April Council meeting we discussed and approved the church applying for the federal CARES / Paycheck Protection Program that passed Congress. This program helps small businesses and churches retain their staff through the hardships of quarantine. We were approved by Capitol Federal Bank for \$23,529.58.
