As many Americans emerge from isolation and strict social-distancing (while others wait to resurface after a vaccine), I have asked my friends and colleagues: What are you going to do now that you're free? They say, "spending less, saving more," doing more outdoor things with the family

(this may explain why all of the bikes, canoe paddles, and outdoor equipment is gone in retail stores), gardening, finishing the to-do-list, and savoring time with family and friends." Some have said they are enjoying being back to their "normal:" eating at their favorite restaurants, gathering in mass with friends, doing everything previously forbidden (sometimes I don't ask). what will you do with the extra energy, money and time you have reclaimed?

The Apostle Paul wanted early Christians to know: They were

Paul wrote them a warning: do not go back into hedonism (the moral philosophy of seeking pleasure and avoiding suffering as the only components of well-being). Instead, they could use their privileged position to pursue a different future: to humbly serve others as Jesus showed us in the Gospels. He wrote:

"You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another

humbly in love " (Gal. 5:13 NLT).

As we revel in our freedoms and enjoy our Independence Day celebrations, let us remember, **American Christians have two liberty days**: The 4th of July (our national holiday), and our Decision Day (the day God sets us free by accepting Jesus' forever forgiveness in faith). What will you do with your freedoms? Will you use them for yourself or humbly fill the needs of someone else?



FINANCE REPORT - Our income for May was \$13,356.75 compared to \$10,164.80 in April. The increase was mainly due to our general offerings that were back to more of a "normal" monthly amount. It also includes a \$750 grant for Baby Closet from the American Baptist Churches of the Central Region. Thank you ABCCR!

Our expenses for May totaled \$17,692.62 compared to \$16,934.29 in April. In reviewing any additional expenses for the month, we had special light bulbs purchased, postage bought, and two payments on our copier contract – one for April and one for May.

Our net income to date is -\$19,698.46. Our approved 2020 budget has us using some of our investment dollars to balance the budget by this time of the year but we have chosen not to move money out of our Wells Fargo investments at this time. Instead we have "borrowed" from the \$26,104.65 offerings designated for the building fund. When we feel it is smart to move some of our investment funds, then we will transfer the building funds into the Capital Campaign account.

The \$23,500 from Capital Federal Bank for the CARES / Paycheck Protection Program was moved out of Capital Federal into our general fund at US Bank to pay for salaries and utilities.

This July we are taking all of our summer events and rolling them into one month! We have Christmas in July collections for our adopted families this December, our 2nd Annual Summer Cash Bash, and this year Doorstep is the Envista Cares charity for July!



Last December Doorstep assisted 277 households involving 883 individuals with Christmas gifts and food. Each year we celebrate "Christmas in July" to get a jump start on collecting new items for our annual Christmas adoption! Our goal is to help alleviate some of the strain during the holidays by also collecting items mid-year. Doorstep will adopt 260 households with 800+ individuals this December through the Christmas Bureau. Our focus for Christmas in July is household items, health kit items, toys, school supplies, gifts for men and women, sheet sets, and blankets. These are items that are not seasonal, and easy to find this time of year! The families we adopt are in need of basic items. They are so happy to receive a new set of dishes, new sheets, pots and pans, or a crockpot! We give every family a blanket or quilt.

Each school aged child we adopt receives school supplies and a backpack, and each household receives a health kit filled with hygiene products, and wrapped with a new bath towel, hand towel and washcloth! Each child receives one bigger toy as their gift, and other smaller items are available along with games, books, stuffed animals, stocking stuffers ato

animals, stocking stuffers etc.

You can bring your Christmas donations to worship in July (if your congregation is open), or to Doorstep, Monday – Friday, 8am – 3pm.


