

FAITH: THE IRON RAIL SUPPORT FOR HOPE

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." Hebrews 11:1

Pastor's Corner - Bernard M. Baruch tells a story about a man sentenced to death by a powerful king. Begging for his life, the prisoner made a promise the emperor could not refuse: the man would receive a reprieve if he could teach his majesty's horse to fly within the year. If he did not succeed, he would be put to death at the end of the year.

When asked by a witness if he believed it was possible to teach the horse to fly as promised, the man relied, "I hope!" "Anything could happen within a year," he said. "The king may die, or I may die, or the horse may die. Furthermore, in a year, who knows? Maybe the horse will learn to fly."

2020 has taught us one thing: we all need hope - the unwavering confidence that God will cause good things will happen in our lives or for the wider world because He is good and working in mighty ways.

One of my hopes this year was growing a few cucumbers. This past spring, I bought seeds, planted them, fertilized the seedlings, and I made sure they had a good support - an iron rail fence. Experience taught me the vines grow higher and healthier with a support system. When I planted the seeds this past spring, all I saw was the dirt and the iron rail fence. I dreamed about the vines covering the fence and harvesting lots of produce by autumn. Slowly the vines grew until now, I have to move all of the leaves and vines to see the fence. And as you can imagine, I have too much produce for one family!

For me, hope grows like the cucumber vines: on the unseen support system of our faith, the Lord. Without the Lord, who can hope?

The well-known English author, G.K. Chesterton, once wrote, "Hope means hoping when things are hopeless, or it is no virtue at all...As long as matters are really hopeful, hope is mere flattery or platitude; it is only when everything is hopeless that hope begins to be a strength." (Quoted in Signs of the Times, April 1993, p. 6)

CHURCH FINANCES - Our income for July was \$14,767 and our income total to date is \$120,348.06 or 50.72%. July budget is at 58.33%. July was a big month for receipt of memorial gifts with a total of \$5,165.

Our expenses for July totaled \$25,171.70 and total for the year is \$146,842.05. We pay our van insurance once a year and it was paid in July. The insurance bill was \$597.22, which was under the \$650 budgeted.

Our net income to date is -\$25,864.00.

Our checking account balance at the end of July was \$10,131.81. We have \$28,262.18 designated for the new building fund.

DOORSTEP - EMERGENCY NEEDS:

Food, Clothing, Rent, Prescriptions, Utilities

Transportation (local gas vouchers/bus tickets)

Who we help: Whether they've lost everything in a house fire or are living alone with a disability, Doorstep's up-front emergency services are for those who require assistance with critical needs while they wait for additional aid. We don't impose income guidelines for emergency services, though most of our neighbors who use these services are at or below the poverty line.

SHORT-TERM NEEDS

Food: Once every eight weeks; this is intended to provide three meals for five days

Clothing: Once every two weeks

Rent: One time per 12-month period

Transportation (local gas vouchers/bus tickets): Vouchers available two times per 12-month period

Prescriptions: Two times per 12-month period (\$150 cap)

Utilities: One time per 12-month period

Who we help: Short-term assistance is designed to help those recovering from sudden loss of employment or health-related issues. These solutions are designed to help our neighbors get back on their feet rather than cope with long-term needs.



ABWCR PROJECT 2019-2020 PARENTING FOR LOVE -AMOS HEALTH & HOPE Nicaragua (Dr. Laura Parajon)

This year's ABWCR Project is to support the development of training materials to empower local volunteer Mother leaders to facilitate breastfeeding, parent-child bonding, and early childhood stimulation, decreasing the long-term negative impact on their children and families. Our central region goal is \$35,000.



As of the close of the May books, the total raised was \$9,531.58. Considering the current COVID-19 situation, it is awesome to have raised 27% of our goal. The close of the June books will reveal an even higher percentage. However, we are a long way from our \$35,000 goal and have only two months to reach that goal.

These times are certainly different from other years we have experienced a shortfall at this time of the year. During the project for 2014-2015, we were also at a great shortage of making our goal. God makes miracles happen. During the last two months of that project period, the women of the central region donated over \$18,000 of the \$32,200 goal, putting the project \$6,000 over the goal. We have always put a lot of monies forward in donations during the last two months. Why do we procrastinate so much? Maybe we all do not realize the shortfall. Or perhaps this year, we are all focused more on 'stay at home' matters and are monies are short because our rallies have not occurred.
