

TOMORROW WILL TAKE CARE OF ITSELF "Do not worry about tomorrow," said Jesus. "Tomorrow will take care of its. Each day had enough trouble of its own" (Matthew 6:34)

Pastor's Corner - Who among us are not thinking about tomorrow, next week, next month, next year, or when this pandemic is over? We are all dreaming about "what we will do when we will get back to normal." Daydreaming and hoping for a better future is a natural part of our human experience. The problem arises when we become fixed on the future rather than living in the moment. We can all agree, we want this experience past us, but only God knows when that is going to happen!

The global crisis has taught me to confess I have no idea what is going to happen next. When I focus on the future - especially my negative thoughts about "what's next?" - then I am filled with dread and worry. That is why Jesus' words have become real for me: enjoy today; no one knows about tomorrow.

Six times in his sermon on the mount, Jesus tells his followers "do not worry" (Greek *me merimnate*): (1) about your life (v. 25), (2) about your bodies (v. 25), (3) about your clothes (v. 28), (4) about what you will eat (v. 31), (5) do not worry about what you will drink (v. 31), or (6) about tomorrow. **The phrase literally means** "take no thought" about - do not be double-minded or bifurcated (split in two). This is why contemporary Christian writer, Eugene Peterson, translated the verse: "Give your entire attention to what God is doing right now, and don't get worked up about what may or may not happen tomorrow. God will help you deal with whatever hard things come up when the time comes.

Henri J.M. Nouwen, "I also came to see that I should not worry about tomorrow, next week, next year, or the next century. The more willing I was to look honestly at what I was thinking and saying and doing now, the more easily I would come into touch with the movement of God's Spirit in me, leading me to the future" (In the Name of Jesus: Reflections on Christian Leadership, p. 13).

What we are called to do every day—regardless of calm or crisis—is to practice contemplative presence: finding God's presence and movement in the now (today). We need to ask the questions: What good happened today? Where did I sense God's presence right now? What can I be thankful for today? Being mindful of God's presence among us today reminds us His faithfulness tomorrow.

OUR CHURCH FINANCES -

Our income for August was \$18,900.91 and our income total to date is \$139,248.97. August budget percentage is at 58.68%. August had five Sundays which made the month of giving the largest for the



year. January total income was the only one larger because of our annual distribution from the Topeka Community Foundation.

Our expenses for August totaled \$17,959.61 and total for the year is \$164,800.28. August budget percentage for expenses is at 62.63%.

Our net income to date is -\$25,551.31. We will be transferring \$25,564.00 from the Wells Fargo endowment revenue budgeted for 2020. Once transferred the budgeted difference will be +\$12.69. At the end of August our checking account total was \$11,081.68. We currently have \$28,802.18 in checking designated for the building fund. Other

funds in the checking account include \$4,692.46 -Youth fund; \$2,600.00 - Outreach fund; and \$,2,485.79 - Baby Closet.

Memorials Committee Report - The Memorials Committee recommended Gil McCurdy's memorial gifts of \$597.00 be used for a new camera and video capture device for the sanctuary. The committee also recommended Ken Paslay's memorial gifts of \$609 be used to help replace the van's power step. The \$500 remainder of the van repair is a budgeted expense. The council approved both recommendations.
