Pastor's Corner - Throughout our faith journey, we are extended several invitations. From the invitation to accept Jesus Christ as our Lord and Savior, to the invitation to care for a sick neighbor, to the invitation to bring food to the next church event, our life in a community of faith is full of invitations. During this fall season, our church community is going to be intentional about how we respond to the variety of invitations we receive and how those invitations spur us along in our faith development.

NEWS FROM THE TREASURER -

Our income for September was \$10,683.00 and our income total to date is \$149,831.97. September budget percentage for the year is 63.14%.



Our expenses for September totaled \$17,959.61 and total for the year is \$181,071.79. September budget percentage for expenses is 68.81%.

Our net income to date is -\$27,875.54. I transferred in early October \$25,564.00 from our Wells Fargo investment account which was the amount we budgeted to use in 2020. This was the interest we earned in 2019.

At the end of September our checking account total was \$10,478.54. We currently have \$33,974.26 in our checking account designated for the building fund. Other funds in the checking account include \$4,730.87 – Youth fund; \$2,600 – Outreach fund; and \$2,412.19 – Baby Closet.

DOORSTEP - Our focus now is this year's version of the Christmas Store. It won't be a Store this year where the clients we adopt through the Christmas Bureau come in and shop for the families. This year we are working even more closely with the Christmas Bureau, United Way, Topeka Rescue Mission and the community by streamlining how we are approaching Christmas adoptions.

Doorstep will still adopt the 260 households and 800+ individuals like before, but what and how we provide food and gifts will change. In 2020, adopted families will receive a \$15 gift card for each family member, our regular Christmas food order, a health kit, and a blanket or quilt.

What we need for Christmas this year is: Towel sets (bath, hand, washcloth), Shampoo/Conditioner, Combs, Bar Soap, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste, Full/Queen and King Blankets only, and money. We need money to purchase the gift cards, the food, and any of the above items not donated. Where we have asked for items in years past, please send a check or go to our website (www.doorsteptopeka.org) to donate by credit card.

All of the items we have collected to date will be saved for next year. This is the best way 🗣 to reduce the number of people we need, and the number of people who are working together at one time. We know it is not ideal, but with COVID, nothing is normal this year, and unfortunately, the Christmas Store process will not be either. Please help where you can.


