THE DELICIOUS TASTE OF BUTTER

Pastor's Corner - Has anyone shoved a bite of food into your mouth and then said, "It's an acquired taste"? Humas was the thing for me. The chickpea-based paste became a new staple I discovered in the Holy Lands. We were not allowed to eat butter during certain meals because of Kosher laws. So, I learned to substitute humas for its place (most of the time). I acquired an affinity for Israeli humas.

ABSENCE MAKES THE HEART GROW **FONDER**

English Proverb

The ten-days of "no butter or dairy while eating meats" showed me how much I had become accustomed to having the solid sweet cream. When I got home, Rexanne asked me what I wanted for supper. "A stick of butter," I replied. I missed its delicious taste (and Dr. Pepper)! I appreciated it more after I restrained myself from eating it on the visit to the land of Jesus.

Christians can think of fasting - abstaining from something - as a punitive exercise, and a frustrating one, like keeping New Year's resolutions. You may have been taught to give up an item for Lent to show how you can suffer for Jesus. Sadly, this was misinformation! The season of Lent (the fortydays prior to Easter, not counting Sundays) was originally a time to mirror Jesus' devotion in the wilderness, and to learn how to overcome temptations. The Council of Nicaea (AD 312) affirmed



Lent as a special time for new converts prepare for baptism and for repentant Christians to rededicate one's life to Jesus. It was declared a "fast" to help Jesus' followers focus on his suffering and passion (not ours) as a way of anticipating the "feast" of the Resurrection. We fasted, not to punish ourselves or prove our faith, but to build up the anticipated joy of its return. It was a positive exercise of eschatological excitement. punishment! Like all human traditions, Lent was only good if it leads one back to God and stirs a greater love for the Lord.


The worship service has a similar austere atmosphere. There are decorations. dark drab colors. and earthenware, wooden candlesticks (no brass, silver, or gold), no flowers, plain candles, no vestments, somber songs, congregational confessions, and more - all to prepare the overwhelmingly worshipper for the celebratory display of Easter with its bright banners, colorful table coverings, fresh flowers, shining trumpets, organ fanfares, and more. Furthermore, Easter's grand festivities help Christians look forward to and yearn for - the glorious worship of the Lamb in the Kingdom of God (Revelation 5:1-14; 19:1-8)!

As we enter the season of Lent, I encourage you to consider making it a season of longing and sweet rewards instead of a repressive period of regrets. Focus on something you hope to hear, see, taste, and enjoy again when Christ appears. Give something up willingly and reverently so that you can enjoy it anew at Easter, like the taste of butter. Along the way, you may discover there are other enjoyable items out there that you may enjoy, like humas. Let me know if you need a good recipe!

OUR CHURCH FINANCES - For from him and to him and through him are all things. To him be glory forever. – Romans 11:36

We have been blessed with a good financial year for our church. As we look at our 2020 finances we made it through the year with a \$3,075.78 budget balance. There were many factors that played into this but it took everyone to make it happen. As a congregation we continue to be generous in our giving and each of council members has worked hard to manage their program budget.

Our income for December was \$18,163.47 and our income total to date is \$272,628.78. Our year-end budget percentage of general income is at 103.6%. This includes a \$50,000 life insurance estate gift of Don Morris.

Our expenses for December totaled \$26,730.63 and total for the year is \$243,053.00. Our year-end budget percentage for expenses is at 92.36%.

The difference of income to expenses for the year is \$29,575.78. This total plus the \$23,500 we received after applying for the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) federal loan brings our total to \$53,075.78. Subtracting out the \$50,000 estate gift, we finished the budget year \$3,075.78 in the black.

At the end of December our checking account total was \$20,599.09. This includes \$37,746.08 in building funds; \$5,084.87 in youth funds; and \$4,858.83 in Outreach. Our balance does not include the PPP loan since the loan has not officially been forgiven yet. All the remaining funds will carry-over to 2021.

The year-end interest earned on our investments at Wells Fargo total \$20,173.18. The 2021 budget was approved with the recommendation the investment budget figure (\$12,000 place saver) would reflect the new number (\$20,173). Therefore, I will make that change on our 2021 budget. FYI - The 2019 investment interest was \$25,864 so 2020 wasn't as bad as we thought it might be.

Offering envelopes for 2021 arrived late and have been handed out or mailed to our church attendees. If you didn't receive offering envelopes and want them, please contact the church office or me personally and we'll get you your new envelopes as soon as we can.
