PENTECOST: A PROMISE TO ALL NATIONS

"Then afterward, I will pour out my spirit on all flesh." Joel 2:28

Pastor's Corner - There is no end to the redeeming power of God when the Almighty One is on a mission to establish righteousness forever among the nations. God promised in the prophecy of Joel to *afterward pour the Spirit on all flesh* which eliminates the language limitations, cultural barriers, and human-made structures that separate and exclude people for the promise to *all nations*.

God made a promise that sons and daughters shall preach the Word with conviction. Old men would dream dreams of worlds seen only by the prophets. Young men would see visions of the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God! God the Father will pour out the Spirit even on male and female slaves – displaying that God's people, captured by the Evil one in sin of depravity and destruction, will be freed. The only persons not named in this Pentecost prophecy are the "old women" who certainly would be included in God's redeeming acts as Sarah was essential to God's promise for Abraham.

God promises to bear witness to the Divine coming, for the cosmos will be filled with the Word of God through the indwelling Spirit before the "day of the Lord." There will be

no excuse for being caught unaware of God's sovereignty, dominion and determination that all bow before the Lord our maker. This is why God will even plead through the mouth of babes for us to repent before the great day of the Lord.

The Pentecost stories in Scripture testify to the fulfilment of God's promise of the Spirit. We can think of the louder Pentecost in Acts 2 with wild winds, flaming tongues, and prophetic preaching as a radical display of promise-





keeping. However, there are other times Jesus gave his spirit in a quieter Pentecost, such as John 20:22, and the generous inclusion of the Gentile (non-Jewish) believers in Acts 10-11.

As we plan to observe the life-giving power of the Church on Pentecost Sunday (May 23) and remember the Spirit's presence in and among us during the season of Pentecost—which lasts from Trinity Sunday (May 30) until Christ the King Sunday (November 21) - let us remember the gift of God is for *all people*. The Spirit of the Lord brings unity, peace, comfort, healing, help, and brakes down all barriers so there is "no distinction between Jew and Gentile; for the same Lord is Lord over all " (Romans 10:12).

May the Church always work and bear witness to God's promise of international inclusion, radical redemption, and death-defying hope in the face of despair. *Come, Holy Spirit, Come! Amen* Prayer: We hear you plead in the Scriptures,

We hear you call in the Word of preachers,

We hear you speak in father and mother,

Now help us hear You in the voice of our Sisters & Brothers. In Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. Blessings

CHILD DEDICATIONS - We will celebrate the dedication of children on Mother's Day and Father's Day. We all know, children are a gift from the Lord! We are called to love God and love others, including children, as faithful followers of Jesus Christ. For Baptists, raising a child "in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" is an important task and responsibility (2 Peter 3:18). One way to mark the start of this journey is for parents to commit themselves to Jesus Christ and to the teachings of the church; and for the church to commit itself to the parents and child. This commitment ceremony is called a Child Dedication.

What does the Bible teach about dedicating children?

The Old Testament contains several examples of parents dedicating their children to God. Since children were a gift from the Lord (Psalm 127:3), the Law required that every new parent had to present their child at a worship service to thank God for His generosity, love, and gift (Exodus 13:1-2).

When Jesus was born, his parents took him to the Temple and dedicated him (Luke 2:21-40). Jesus was blessed by the leaders, welcomed by the faithful and dedicated to the Lord's service. This was an important event in Jesus' lifetime.

As an adult, Jesus gathered children into his arms. He laid hands on them, prayed for them, and blessed them (Matthew 19:13-15). Jesus loved little children; and so, do we! Jesus used children as examples of God's kingdom workers. Therefore, Christians today continued the practice of dedicating children to the Lord.

What is the difference between a child dedication and an infant baptism or christening?

Some Christian churches practice infant baptism or christening. Baptists do not baptize or christen infants because the practice is not found in the Bible. The Scriptures teach that



only believers – persons who have personally professed faith on their own – are to be baptized. The Bible teaches that baptism is reserved only for those who can decide for themselves to follow Jesus Christ. When an older child, teen or adult makes the decision to accept Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior, and publicly shares this faith, is a person baptized. This is called "believers' baptism." West Side Baptist Church practices believers' baptism by immersion as prescribed in the Bible (Matthew 3:13-17) and Church Covenant.

Historically, child dedications have been a vital part of the Baptist tradition. Children are important to God and to the church! Therefore, Baptists have practiced the service of child dedication to express their thanksgiving, love, and support for God's gift. Countless Baptist churches continue to practice child dedications, today.

What is included in a Child dedication service? Child dedications are celebrated during any regular morning worship service. They are traditionally held during the infant's first year of life. Services will include: Readings from Scripture, A promise or vow by the parents to raise their child with Christian values, to teach her or him the Bible, to respect God's creation, to faithfully attend and support the church, and to live a Christian life. The congregation makes a promise to support the family in prayer, Bible study, teaching, service, and Christian love. A prayer of commitment and blessing for both the parents and the child.

Parents will want to invite family and friends to share in this special worship service. We traditionally give a small token of love during the service. If you would like someone special to hold your infant or wish to include your entire family on the platform, please speak to the pastor prior to the service.

A child may wear any appropriate clothing, including an heirloom gown, a dress, suit, or any other outfit. Parents and family are asked to dress accordingly.

To set a date for your child's dedication, please contact the Church Office at (785) 233-4241 or speak with the minister. There are no fees for this service.

It is true that they grow up way to fast. It has been an adjustment for both of us, but we feel it was the right choice to move here. We miss all our Topeka friends.
