GROWING IS GOD'S BUSINESS!

"All by itself the soil produces grain--first the stalk, then the head, then the full kernel in the head" (Mark 4:28)

Pastor's Corner - Do you remember the nursery rhyme "Mary, Mary, Quite Contrary" by Mother Goose? It goes:

Mary, Mary, quite contrary How does your garden grow? With silver bells and cockleshells And pretty maids all in a row.

I never understood this children's song. Who was Mary contrary? Who puts cockleshells in the garden, except to add calcium to the soil? Why were there maids in the garden? Many experts have explained the song's meaning, including stories about Mary Queen of Scots, Mary Tudor, and others.

The line which stuck with me as a child was, "How does your garden grow?" My grandfather was a gardener, and I wanted to be like him. He taught me good seed, good soil, hard work, consistent watering, weeding, and determination makes gardens grow. Right? Not always.

Like many persons stuck at home during the pandemic, I expanded my enjoyment of gardening. I read some of the studies which highlighted the positive effects of gardening on people's wellbeing, mood, and nerves. Digging in the dirt has a calming effect upon many of us!

I built raised beds, prepared the soil, planted good seeds, watered them, and waited for my small vegetable patch to produce a bounty, but it did not give me everything I expected. Some seeds did not sprout, others the squirrels ate, and some, like the Zinnias, flourished. I had no control over if, when, or how many of the seeds would grow. But, I know, *growing seeds is God's business*! In his parable of the growing seed, Jesus told us this irrefutable fact, "All by itself the soil produces grain." (Mark 4:26-29). Gardeners must do everything in their power to prepare and promote growth, but in the end, the Lord causes things to grow!

Growing spiritually and numerically as a congregation is like gardening. We can do everything in our power to prepare for and promote growth, but ultimately, **God causes the**

Christian and the Christian church to grow! As Psalm 127:1 teaches us, "Unless the Lord builds the house, those who build it labor in vain."

One way to prepare for church growth is a process called **Natural Church Development (NCD)**. It is a process to increase the health of a church that pinpoints where to focus attention to improve health and release greater growth potential. It is a spiritual journey that involves people and empowers them to make positive changes in their congregation. The main objective is to increase the overall health of a congregation by measuring eight Quality Characteristics:

- 1.Empowering Leadership
- 2. Gift-Oriented Ministry
- 3. Passionate Spirituality
- 4. Functional Structure
- 5.Inspiring Worship
- 6. Holistic Small Groups
- 7. Need-oriented Evangelism
- 8.Loving Relationships

NCD helps church leaders ask the essential questions: What must we do to prepare for God's growth? How can we join God's work in the world using the spiritual momentum He is already creating? Where should we focus God's resources to fulfill Christ's mission?

Starting this summer, we will be engaging in an expedition to see where God yearns to expand His kingdom in our neighborhood. We will hold prayer retreats, investigate demographic information, engage in meaningful conversations about strategies, and some of our members will be asked to complete a survey. We will do our best to prepare for God's work among us, through us, and in us. I hope we will be pleasantly surprised by the Lord. ~ Blessings, Pastor Ivan+

Our Church Finances

The Memorials Committee (Alice Payne, Molly Morris, Bev McCurdy, Pastor Greuter and



Nancy Lindberg) met recently to discuss and recommend to the church council several memorial accounts for items approved to be purchased for the church.

- The family of Judy Longstaff requested rose bushes and an angel statue for the bench area on the northeast corner of the church. The committee recommends the approximate \$500 for these items out of Judy's memorial that currently totals more than \$3,750.
- The expense of approximately \$4,500 for a new digital media console for the sanctuary was recommended out of the older memorial accounts including Ila Mae Martin's memorial. A list of those memorials will be announced once families have been contacted.
- A music cart to store and move the old hymnals from Holmer Hall to/from the music room was recommended for approximately \$400 and that memorial will also be announced once the family has been contact and the council has approved.

Our income for April was \$22,547.72. Our total income for the year to date is \$104,127.27. Our budget percentage of income through April is 48.73 %. Our budget year is 33.3 %.

Our expenses for April total \$20,001.15. Our expenses total for the year is \$82,036.91, which is 33.65 % of our budget.

The difference of income to expenses for the year is \$22,090.36.

I announced recently that West Side Baptist was approved to receive \$29,487.00 as part of the second round of the federal Payroll Protection Program (PPP). This amount was based on our church payroll and utilities for the 2nd quarter (April, May and June) of 2020. This money was deposited in our capital campaign account at Capitol Federal Bank. I transferred \$12,058.83 for our April 2021 expenses – \$9,269.80, gross payroll, and \$2,789.03, utilities. I'll do the same for May in early June and for June in early July. Once this money has been spent, I will complete the paperwork for the PPP loan to be forgiven. Our first PPP loan received in 2020 was for \$23,500.00. This federal program is being used by many small businesses including churches to provide financial assistance during the struggles of COVID-19.

Following is a summary of the items we our Mission

Committee meeting after church in May: 1) We will be collecting the One Great Hour of Sharing offering in June. We are setting the goal at \$1500.

- 2) Bethel will be resuming their summer youth program in person for June and July with some restrictions. I will continue to monitor the situation.
- 3) I would like to determine if there is interest in a Fall mission project. I have not contacted any place yet; I would like to see how many are interested first. If there are enough people, we can consider an out-of-state project like Murrow, or something closer to home. We can discuss that later. Please let me know if you are interested in participating in a Fall mission project and if you have a specific project preference.


