Pastor's Corner - Do you ever feel guilty for taking time off? Do you spend your vacations worrying about the things you should be doing at home or the office? Do you take your to-do list with you on family excursions? It is hard to disconnect from our daily demands and get a little rest and relaxation. Taking time to reconnect with family and ourselves is essential for cultivating a healthy mind, body, and spirit! God create us to renew ourselves by designing the seasons.

The Midsummer season has become an ideal time to enjoy the American vacation, at least since 1869. The Smithsonian magazine published an enlightening Special Report on the topic: "Where Was the Birthplace of the American Vacation?" Thanks to the ingenious insight of "a handsome young preacher from Boston named William H.H. Murray," the idea of taking a trip in the middle of summer leaped across the Atlantic with the publication of "one of the first guidebooks to a wilderness area." Tony Perrottet writes in the Smithsonian article, "In his guide to the Adirondack Mountains, we are told, 'Murray broached the then-outrageous idea that an excursion into raw nature could actually be pleasurable. Before that date, most Americans considered the country's primeval landscapes only as obstacles to be conquered. But Murray's self-help opus. Adventures in the Wilderness; or, Camp-Life in the Adirondacks, suggested that hiking, canoeing and fishing in



unsullied nature were the ultimate health tonic for harried dwellers city whose constitutions were weakened bγ the demands of civilized life." (Smithsonian Magazine, April 2013). Americans clamored from the cities into wilderness and onto the beaches.



The idea of taking a family vacation was born. This annual adventure become even stronger in the 1950s and 60s with the advent of the automobile, the American Automobile Assoc. (AAA), the interstate, and the family road trip.

Our Church Finances

The first meeting of the Long Range Planning Committee to address the building and property needs of our church met on Saturday, June 5th. Committee members include: Harry Carpenter, Tom Mansfield, Dick May, Clarence Payne, Nathan Poe, Pastor Ivan Greuter and Nancy Lindberg. I plan to keep you informed on our discussions. We would appreciate your input as we look at the needs of our church in the coming years. Please make suggestions and feel free to ask any questions.

1. We reviewed prior campaigns.

- a. In 2008 "Strengthening our Foundation for Missions" Campaign raised \$400,000 to install an elevator, renovate Holmer Hall, mount a new roof, add a family/handicapped accessible bathroom, refresh the landscape and complete smaller projects. 10% designated for missions.
- b. In 2018 "Major Repairs" Campaign raised \$50,000 to repair/replace the boilers and purchase a sign for the parking lot.
- **2.** We discussed current Building Fund Accounts (April 2021 report)
- a. Checking Account \$79,721 (includes Don Morris \$50,000 life insurance)
- b. Money Market \$18,627
- c. General Fund Designated for Building Repairs or Capital Campaign \$38,491
- **3.** We started identifying building and grounds needs.
- 4. Next committee meeting June 26, 2021

Our income for May was \$17,138. Our total income for the year to date is \$121,064.27. Our budget percentage of income through May is 56.66 %. Our budget year is 41.67 %.

Our expenses for May totals \$15,626.15. Our expenses total for the year is \$97,663.06, which is 40.06% of our budget.


