

OUR CHURCH FINANCES - Last month I reported on the first meeting of the Long Range Planning Committee. This is the committee to address the building and property needs of our church. We had a second meeting on June 26th and decided we would like suggestions/

recommendations from the congregation. Therefore, you will be receiving a survey in with your second quarterly giving statement. If you have any suggestions on repairs, replacements or new items for our church building and grounds that you would like considered, we ask you to complete the form and put it in the offering plate or in my mailbox outside of the church office. Once the list is finalized and a cost estimate prepared, we will prioritize and then complete our capital campaign.

Our income for June was \$12,204.05. Our total income for the year to date is \$133,274.32. Our budget percentage of income through June is 62.37%. Our budget year is 50%.

Our expenses for June total \$21,472.97. Our expenses total for the year is \$121,559.07, which is 49.86% of our budget.

The difference of income to expenses for the year is \$11,715.25. This does not include the \$29,487 from our second Payroll Protection Program (PPP). We hope to have the loan forgiveness paperwork completed by the end of the month.

Doorstep News & Needs – How You Can Help!

Doorstep offers many services to help our neighbors in need every day. But, there are two programs in the community that we have really been at the heart of, doing what we can to help.

The first program, <u>Impact Avenues</u>, is a program through the City of Topeka which helps homeless families with at least one school aged child. The families attend a series of classes, and once completed are placed into a home. Doorstep has helped at times with rent assistance, gas vouchers, utility assistance car repairs, food, clothing and more. The piece most people don't know about is that Doorstep also helps provide household & kitchen items, bedding, towels, lamps, and other items when the family is placed into their new home.

<u>Items we need to best help these families are</u>: (Gently used, not new)

- Queen & Twin comforters and blankets (Impact helps with beds in these sizes)
- Pillows (new preferred)
- Small Household Appliances toasters, mixers, coffee pots, etc
- Curtains, Silverware, Lamps

The other program is still a new adventure! It is **MAP** (**Mobile Access Partnership**), this is truly a community effort. In a partnership between Valeo and Topeka Rescue Mission there will be a food trailer from TRM, health trailer from Stormont Vail, and currently, the Shower & Laundry Trailer is open. The trailer(s) moves to different locations within the city each week to allow people who are homeless or in need of a shower, laundry services or bathrooms the opportunity to use the trailer. Doorstep has been providing clothing for men and women, in a variety of sizes, to the program so people accessing the showers can have a new set of socks and underwear (from TRM), and a fresh set of clothing (from Doorstep) to put on afterwards. We continue to stock our clothing room for clients who need that service, and provide clothing to the MAP shower trailer as well. All of these items come from donations brought to Doorstep by our member congregation members, and the community at-large. Some of our member congregations are host locations for the trailers. Our volunteers and the staff feel very proud to be a part of this wonderful new service that has been created. And, currently, we are the only agency providing the clothing.

Items we currently need to help MAP are: (Gently used)

- Men's Jeans: Waist Sizes 30, 32, 40 and 42
- Men's & Women's Shorts All Sizes
- Women's Sun/Summer Slip-on Dresses Sizes Large, X-Large and XX-Large

- Hygiene Kit Items: Shampoo, Conditioner, Razors, Body Lotion & Hair Brushes
- Baby Wipes
- Food: Vegetable Soup, Egg Noodles, Jelly, Canned Fruit, Ramen Noodles, Pancake Mix & Syrup.
