Council President's Corner

Annual Business Meeting

Church Treasurer's Report...

The breakfast meeting to discuss and approve the 2022 budget was Sunday, December 5th. For those of you unable to attend, the new budget was approved by the congregation. A copy of the final budget will be included in the annual report available in January. Overall, we have increased our expected income for 2022 based on our experience of giving in 2021 and a new stream of income from the estate of Portia and Vern Allbert. The increases in expenditures budgeted for 2022 includes rising utility costs, funds for additional outreach projects and most importantly a 3 % salary increase for our staff. We also included an additional 1% merit increase to our pastor.

Pledges continue to come in for both our annual stewardship campaign and the 3-year **Fortifying our Foundation for the Future Capital Campaign.** You can still turn your pledge into the church office or place it in the offering plate. Copies of pledge forms are available on the bookshelf outside the office.

I will be giving an update on the Capital Campaign at our annual meeting in January. My initial report given at the December breakfast meeting was that we are about half-way to our \$300,000 goal with our pledges and gifts. I announced then and will state again that the council will proceed with the 21 projects that you approved on our wish list only when the money is in hand over the next 3 years. The repair of the church steeple and replacement of the north parking lot were high on the list and it looks like they will be worked on in early spring. The expansion of the baby closet is one project that will be completed soon. Bids on other projects are being requested.

Finance overview for November 2021: Our income for November was \$16,403.59 compared to \$12,844.00 in October. Our total income for the year to date is \$253,709.90. Our budget percentage of income through November is 118.73%. Our budget year is 91.67%.

Our expenses for November totals \$17,706.86 compared to \$22,706.86 in October. Our expenses total for the year is \$216,811.01 which is 88.94% of our budget.

The difference of income to expenses for the year shown on the finance reports is \$36,898.89.

We Need Your Help...

If you are looking for a service opportunity within our church, Outreach and Evangelism has many needs for volunteers.

The most critical need is in evangelism. We are presenting new visitors with a loaf of banana bread or similar (without nuts) to thank them for their visit. I need people to make the bread and I need people to visit and drop the bread off to the visitors. The names and contact information will be provided so that you can arrange a visit.

If you like to organize and run activities, I need you to take over our regular and special events. Our regular events include Super Bowl Sunday, Easter egg hunt, and Trunk or Treat. Other events may include game nights, movie nights, and other events that will attract people into our church.

We run a weekly food pantry every Wednesday weather and food availability permitting. We need people sorting food before the start of the food pantry when needed. We need people to interview and gather necessary information from our clients wanting food. We need people to load the food into vehicles. Boxes may weigh up to 25 lbs but often there are smaller loads that need to be handled. Set up and take down help is needed before and after the food pantry. Every 3rd Wednesday, we also give away milk which we need to account for separately.

Baby Closet is open for 3 time periods during the week. Help is needed to greet clients at the door and direct them to the Baby Closet. Help is needed to gather the necessary information from the clients and assist them in obtaining items. Help is also needed to sort clothes and items donated and to assist in seasonal change over of clothing items.

Every year, our church is asked to participate with other churches and non-profit organizations in events to provide needed services for our community. "Get Down and Dirty" and "Sharefest" are two of the events where we spend a half of a day cleaning up and improving specific areas around the city. I would like to see more representation of our church at those events. We are a part of Midtown Community Services, an organization of churches, schools, and other volunteers to provide services for our immediate neighborhoods. Help is needed to coordinate our part in providing these services

I would like to set up one day a month to volunteer at our Harvester warehouse in sorting food. They are in constant need of help and we depend on them for our weekly food and supplies for our pantry, kitchen, and baby closet.

This is what we do. We can do more. We need your help.
