### **Church Treasurer's Report...**

Our income for December was \$16,182.80. Our total income for 2021 was \$283,130.72. We budgeted \$213,689.00 for the year so we finish the year at 132.5%.

Our expenses for December total \$29,422.50. Our total expense for 2021 was \$246,428.98. We budgeted \$243,779 for the year so we finish the year at 101.09%.

The difference of income to expenses for the year is \$36,701.74. Part of this difference was due to the \$29,487 from the federal Paycheck Protection Program income paid in September and \$1,000 administration costs of several outreach grants also paid in September.

The 2021 year-end individual giving statements have been distributed. If you did not get yours, please let me know and I'll make you a copy. Also, after you review your report, please contact me if you have any questions. If you would like more information on your designated giving, I would be glad to print you a detailed report.

The 2022 tithing envelopes have been distributed. Anyone not receiving your envelopes should check with me. The envelopes this year are NOT dated as in past years. They can be used for any giving to the church at any time throughout the year.

Be sure to review the 2021 Annual Report. Finance reports included are: the year-end profit and loss statement, the memorial fund gifts and expenditures, a review of the designated monies and how much will carry over into 2022, the two capital campaign reports (2008 campaign and new 2022-2024 campaign) and the approved 2022 budget.

Give on or before Super Bowl Sunday Feb. 13, 2022 **DOORSTEP** - In 2021, Doorstep spent \$342,434 on emergency services; this is over \$91,000 more compared to 2020. It was a challenging year, and our small staff is incredibly grateful to our volunteers who kept coming in week after week to help us provide services, sort donations, and help clothing room clients. We also feel very blessed by the support we have received from the Topeka community during this time!

**Souper Bowl Sunday is February 13<sup>th</sup>** and we are again asking our member congregations to collect soup and crackers to help stock our food pantry! Watch for sales and gather your donations! We can use all varieties of soup, and crackers. A successful Souper Bowl Sunday can stock our pantry with these items into the Spring months!

In June we had our 55<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Kick-off to raise funds for a new HVAC system at Doorstep. The current system, original to the building, is over 60 years old. At year end, we had donations of \$50,000! That is 1/3 of the amount needed. we have another \$100,000 to go! We are working on a match donation opportunity in February, and more information will be coming...

Unfortunately, with COVID still an issue, we will not have Operation Soup Line in 2022.

Finally, **Thank You** to everyone who donated money, blankets, games, puzzles and hygiene items for **Doorstep's Christmas Project** this past December! We assisted a total of **259 households with 822 individuals**! Hopefully, next year we can be back to 'normal' with the actual Christmas Store.



## We Need Your Help...

If you are looking for a service opportunity within our church, Outreach and Evangelism has many needs for volunteers.

The most critical need is in evangelism. We are presenting new visitors with a loaf of banana bread or similar (without nuts) to thank them for their visit. I need people to make the bread and I need people to visit and drop the bread off to the visitors. The names and contact information will be provided so that you can arrange a visit.

If you like to organize and run activities, I need you to take over our regular and special events. Our regular events include Super Bowl Sunday, Easter egg hunt, and Trunk or Treat. Other events may include game nights, movie nights, and other events that will attract people into our church.

We run a weekly food pantry every Wednesday weather and food availability permitting. We need people sorting food before the start of the food pantry when needed. We need people to interview and gather necessary information from our clients wanting food. We need people to load the food into vehicles. Boxes may weigh up to 25 lbs but often there are smaller loads that need to be handled. Set up and take down help is needed before and after the food pantry. Every 3rd Wednesday, we also give away milk which we need to account for separately.

Baby Closet is open for 3 time periods during the week. Help is needed to greet clients at the door and direct them to the Baby Closet. Help is needed to gather the necessary information from the clients and assist them in obtaining items. Help is also needed to sort clothes and items donated and to assist in seasonal change over of clothing items.

Every year, our church is asked to participate with other churches and non-profit organizations in events to provide needed services for our community. "Get Down and Dirty" and "Sharefest" are two of the events where we spend a half of a day cleaning up and improving specific areas around the city. I would like to see more representation of our church at those events. We are a part of Midtown Community Services, an organization of churches, schools, and other volunteers to provide services for our immediate neighborhoods. Help is needed to coordinate our part in providing these services

I would like to set up one day a month to volunteer at our Harvester warehouse in sorting food. They are in constant need of help and we depend on them for our weekly food and supplies for our pantry, kitchen, and baby closet.


