

As much as we would like to return to pre-COVID ways of providing services at Doorstep, we aren't there yet. But, we continue providing food, clothing, prescriptions, pet household items, rent, utilities, food, hygiene kits, diapers, dental and gas vouchers, and local bus tickets by appointment or via phone intake.

It would be wonderful to have an Annual Banquet and Quilt Drawing again, perhaps sometime this year we will feel comfortable having these events and celebrating our dedicated volunteers and Doorstep!

We will have Christmas in July focusing on specific donations, and our 3rd Summer Cash Bash with matching funds already secured!

Speaking of matching funds... Our wonderful supporters and donors met the HVAC Match Challenge in less than 3 weeks' time! And, while that didn't get us all the way to the goal line... we have received additional funds, and pledges, that will get us to the \$180,000 budget for the new HVAC system!! YAY! We have signed the contract to lock in prices, the equipment has been ordered, and we expect to start the project in mid-September. We cannot thank all of those who donated to this special project enough for your support of this need. We have been blown away by the generosity of so many who believe in the mission of Doorstep!



GLOBAL SERVANT SPOTLIGHT

Annie & Jeff Dieselberg - ANNIE and JEFF serve in Bangkok, Thailand. Annie is the founding CEO of NightLight International, a global organization compelled by love to reach out to, rescue, and restore the lives of those who have been negatively affected by sex trafficking and commercial sexual exploitation. NightLight Bangkok has assisted over 190 Thai women through employment and repatriated over 230 trafficked women to their home countries. Jeff serves as a chaplain for Night-Light and as co-pastor of Song Sawang Church, which was founded with from women NightLight and has grown to include their children, extended family members, and neighbors.

Church Treasurer's Report...

Our Church Finances

First quarter statements have gone out. I'm hoping you reviewed your statement to make sure your gifts are recorded and the pledges – offerings and/or capital campaign – you made are correct. If not, please let me know so that we can check on it for you.

We are healthy financially. Here are the numbers:

Our income for March was \$17,231.67 with a total of \$66,108.78 for the year. This is 24.95% of our budget. $\frac{1}{4}$ of the budget year is 25%.

Our expenses for March totaled \$31,451.53 with a total of \$74,564.48 which is 28.89% of our budget. Our biggest expenditures for March included a \$11,094 annual insurance bill and Youth Fund expenditures of \$526.20.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$101,071.55. The majority of this is the new Capital Campaign monies totaling \$134,667.07 which includes a Mission portion of \$5,643. It also includes Outreach funds totaling \$10,486.52 and our Youth fund of \$5,673.40.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$5,442.31.

Founded in 1974, Rainbow Acres is a Christian community with heart that empowers adults with developmental disabilities to live to their fullest potential with dignity and purpose. We provide exceptional special needs housing, life-enriching programs, and loving, holistic healthcare in a safe, vibrant, inclusive ranch-style community. We're located in Arizona's scenic high desert of Verde Valley, just 1 ½ hours north of Phoenix and a short drive from Sedona. Our residents, affectionately called Ranchers, live, work, and socialize with their peers in a safe and caring environment. Love, hope, and faith create a community of authentic joy and growth.

Heart and Home at Rainbow Acres

Rainbow Acres facilities include homes equipped to service special needs of 10 residents per house, a state-of-the-art health and wellness center, multi-purpose community center, educational classrooms, arts enrichment creative and performance spaces, a barn for horses and other animals and functional greenhouses for year-round harvests and much more.

Special Needs of Rainbow Acres Resident Ranchers

Rainbow Acres serves a population of 90 to 125 adults from ages 18 to 80s who have relocated from across the U.S. and been diagnosed with a wide range of illnesses, intellectual and developmental disabilities such as Down Syndrome, Autism, Fragile X, Cerebral Palsy, Stroke, Memory Impairment, OCD, Bipolar, etc. Most of the resident Ranchers manage other significant health issues such as Anxiety, Diabetes, Eyesight and Hearing Impairment and severe allergy or dietary restrictions. We offer a cultural-rich living environment, and all faiths are welcome

How Am. Baptist Women of the Central Region (ABWCR) is going to help

The Frese House is a place to call home for some of the more mature female residents and is one of the oldest residential houses at Rainbow Acres. This home needs a complete refurbishment since its construction over 20 years ago. We will be raising \$30,000 to help with this need including the following:

Upgraded suite of new heavy duty and energy efficient appliances including electric stove/ oven, microwave, dishwasher, refrigerator, washer and dryer

Suite of Great Room furniture including large sofa with durable leather upholstery, dining room table and chairs ensemble to set 12 individuals, glider recliners (4) suitable for physical challenges, flat screen smart TV for entertainment and video/streaming education

Replace water heaters (4)

Replace HVAC heat pump
