From the Pastor: The Future is a Bright as the Promises of God

When people ask me if I would like to live in any past period, my immediate answer is "No." I like living now. I like modern medicine. I am accustomed to our world's amenities, technology, and conveniences.

Don't get me wrong, as a history enthusiast, I dabble in nostalgia. But while we may enjoy daydreaming about the past, the past often appears brighter in the rearview mirror.

In Isaiah 43, the people of God were living in Babylonian captivity. The temple was destroyed, their friends and family were uprooted, and the people mourned the loss of lives and homes. We hear their lament in Psalm 137:1, "by the rivers of Babylon—there we sat down, and there we wept when we remembered Zion." Who would not ask if there was hope?

Into their disillusionment, God speaks prophetic words for the future. The Lord says, "Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing..." (Isaiah 43:18-19). Almighty God tells the people of faith to have confidence in the One who worked mightily and miraculously in the past because God could and would act again. The former times were critical—God's people experienced first-hand the Lord's liberating and redemptive work in the Exodus. The great "I AM who I AM" (Exodus 3:14) assured the people that God's new thing would eclipse the old and redefine it globally. If the Lord Almighty can save people out of Egypt, can God rescue all people among the nations? God showed the faithful that their Savior was alive, active, capable, and ready to rescue them again.

The people would once again be eyewitnesses of God's salvation in their midst by testifying to the new life salvation brings in desert places, "now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:19b). What God did in the past would be seen again as redemption's work burst forth with new life among them. Scarcity, starvation, and survival would give way to overwhelming abundance and blessings. God's creativity is inexhaustible when it comes to the Lord fulfilling the gospel mission of saving people. God spares nothing—not even Jesus Christ—to bring hope, love, redemption, and new life to people worldwide. Even the wild animals—the jackals and the ostriches (v. 20)—would benefit from

God's lavish loving grace.

The Lord would accomplish this saving work for one purpose: "the people whom I formed for myself so that they might declare my praise" (v. 21).

As we receive the World Mission Offering, I am reminded of God's great work in the past: two centuries of calling, commissioning, supporting, and sending thousands of missionaries into God's world for redemptive work. We could stop as a mission agency—pause and applaud all God has done in and through us. We could retire knowing "the best is behind us." However, the Lord has not completed the work of bringing hope, healing, liberation, and restoration to the people God loves "from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages" (Revelation 7:9). If God is not done, can the church be done spreading the good news of God's love among us?

I hold on to the wise words of our first missionary, Adoniram Judson, who wrote, *"the Future is as Bright as the Promises of God."* What mind-blowing miracles will God do through International Ministries in the future? What new relationships and technologies will God use to carry the love of Jesus into the world? How will my children and my children's children be eyewitnesses to God's saving actions? I want to be part of God's ongoing work—I hope you do, too!

### **Church Treasurer's Report...**

#### **Our Church Finances**

Our income for August was \$14,817.05 with a total of \$158,159.24 for the year. We are at 59.7% of our budget. 8/12 of the budget year is 66.67%.

Our expenses for August totaled \$20,669.14 with a yearly total of \$189,214.48 which is 73.32% of our budget.



Our expenditures for August to highlight include: #6270 – Organist – \$341.80 and line item is now over budget; #7720 – Minor Maintenance/ Improvements -\$953.75 and line item is now over budget; and #7810 Electricity and #7820 Gas – Utilities are close to total amount budgeted.

The difference of income to expenses for the first eight months of the year is

\$-31,055.24 compared to last month difference of \$-25,451.26.

Our checking/savings account balance in our main account shown on the balance sheet is \$67,226.80.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$6,054.17.

Early in October you will be receiving your third quarter report on your financial giving. Please let us know if you have any questions on your report.

At our next council meeting the council members will be presenting their first budget recommendations for 2023. Please feel free to talk with a council member if you have something that you would like included in next year's budget.

The Memorials Committee will be meeting to discuss a request by the worship committee to use some memorial dollars for new hymnals that the committee has purchased.

# DOORSTEP

The work has begun on our new HVAC system! Thank you to everyone who donated towards our 55<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Fund to make this upgrade possible, and completely paid for once complete!

The staff and volunteers have begun working on our annual Doorstep Christmas Adoption Project. We will adopt 260 households with 800+ individuals from the Christmas Bureau again this year.

#### What we really need right now are school

**supplies**, especially as they go on clearance, **and full-sized hygiene items** to make the health kits. We need to have all of these items assembled and ready to hand out by Thanksgiving. This will allow us to focus on other aspects of the distribution process. We need to collect the following items in October:

**School Supplies** ~ Backpacks, spiral notebooks, folders, notebook paper (150-200 sheets), pens, pencils, crayons 24 ct., 12-inch rulers, scissors, erasers, highlighters, markers, pencil sharpeners, and glue sticks. Last year we provided school supplies for the second half of the year for 273 children.

#### Hygiene Items for the Health Kits ~

We have lots of towels! We need the items that go inside. Full sized items only please. We will make 260 kits to provide for 800+ individuals... We need shampoo, conditioner (2+1 ok), bar soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, brushes, and deodorant.


