

All the people had during this dark time was HOPE!


Advent—the four weeks before Christmas - is all about HOPE! Christians use this time to remember God's promise to rescue, redeem, resurrect, and return to His people. It's a season to remember Jesus Christ's Second Coming, not his birth. God promised to send a Savior, AND HE DID by sending Jesus as a babe of Bethlehem. Advent reminds us that God promised to send Jesus again on the last day. Our faith is built on the word of God's promise: God will come. Jesus will redeem us. God will rescue us and be with us forever -Emmanuel! As we prepare for Christmas 2022, keep saying to yourself, "He is Coming!" It's a promise God plans to keep!

My recent trip to the Outer Banks (OBX) of North Carolina for a missionary conference was full of worship, work, and wrestling with difficult decisions. It was a work trip, and we worked eight to ten hours daily. Nevertheless, I wanted to see the sunrise on the beach as a spiritual moment.



I rose early each morning (5:00 am) to walk to the beach in the dark. I sat quietly while listening to the waves and prayed before dawn (just as Jesus did in the Gospels). It was well worth my energy and effort! I captured this remarkable picture at sunrise one of the mornings. Yes! It was cold and windy, and I was tired, but I could not miss the opportunity to be reminded: *"The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness"* (Lamentations 3:22-23). # TREASURER'S REPORT

Our income for October was \$35,088.91 with a total of \$210,770.65 for the year. We are at 79.56% of our budget. 10/12 of the budget year is 83.33%. The income for this month included the \$1,500 grant for Blessing Boxes.

Our expenses for October totaled \$22,735.66 with a yearly total of \$230,754.35 which is 89.42% of our budget.

The difference of income to expenses for the first ten months of the year is **\$-19,983.70** compared to last month difference of \$-32,604.83. Once again, we have enough money in our checking account for cash flow because of the capital campaign funds.

We received a check for \$32,898.94 from our insurance company to cover the repairs to the air conditioner from the storm damage. Most of the repairs have been paid.

Our checking/savings account balance in our main account shown on the balance sheet is \$70,553.74. This includes the capital campaign, youth, and outreach funds.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$6,179.17.






# **OUTREACH & EVANGELISM**
