



MISSION TRIP TO LIBERIA, WEST AFRICA I am absolutely overwhelmed with gratitude!! It was a dream, I thought, when the Liberia Baptist Theo. Seminary (LBTS) in Monrovia, West Africa and International Ministries (Am. Baptist Foreign Mission Society) invited me to teach Christian New Testament Theology in January 2023.

I agreed to go *IF* the Church Council approved the trip as a substitute for a sabbatical (a 12-week period of rest, renewal and research every seven years). Be careful! God has plans!! Not only did the Church Council unanimously approve of the trip, they agreed to sponsor me on this trip with prayers.

So, I thought, Jesus sent his disciples two-by-



We started to fundraise, knowing we only had six weeks to raise \$7,000.00 (the COST is \$3,500.00 per person). I thought it was an impossible task. How can I raise a thousand dollars a

week during the holiday season? To our great surprise, we were able to raise our goal and a little more thanks to the generosity of our church members, family, friends in Illinois and Nebraska, regional Mission & Evangelism team, and area churches. The Lord is right, "Nothing is impossible with God" (Luke 1:37).

MISSION TRIP:

TEACH THEOLOGY

Jessa and I were able to get our shots (four each, including a vaccination for Typhoid and Yellow Fever), purchase our airfare, arrange transportation, book hotels, and get needed supplies, like mosquito netting.

After prayer and consultation with our mission partners, we were informed the extra funds we raised were needed for projects such as carrying used religious books in suitcases for their library, One Great Hour of Sharing projects and a work site our regional American Baptist Women's Ministries are supporting.

Rev. Art Campbell has agreed to serve as Minister in Resident in January. He will preach, officiate funerals (hopefully, we'll have none) and answer all emergency calls. McCurdy will be teaching Bible studies on Wednesdays. I am grateful for these leaders!

Jessa and I have started to collect the supplies needed to live in Liberia for a month—such as solar powered phone chargers, solid/dry shampoo, wet wipes (no running water), special water filters for drink water, etc. Jessa has already planned what movies we plan to watch on the sixteen hour flight (one way) to/from Africa. It's exciting to think that all this is possible because of GOD and YOU! Thank you for this indescribable gift!! I am truly grateful!

We will return on Tuesday, January 31. Pray for us!!

TREASURER'S REPORT

It is hard to believe 2022 has come to a close. Our church ended the year healthy financially with a successful first year of a 3-year capital campaign, **Fortifying Our Foundation for the Future**. A review of the capital campaign projects completed and plans for 2023 and 2024 will be shared at our January 29th annual meeting and potluck dinner. I hope you will plan to attend. If you didn't make a capital campaign pledge last year, it is never too late. Just indicate your pledge on your next giving envelope.

Nelda Janway and I prepared your 2023 giving envelopes so please throw away any 2022 envelopes left and begin using your 2023 envelopes. If you did not get envelopes and would like a set, please let Nelda or me know.

Our income for November was \$19,595.80 with a total of \$230,366.45 for the year. We are at 86.95% of our budget. 11/12 of the budget year is 91.67%. The income for this month included \$451 in the Youth fund #5185 for their popular pie auction and \$370 for the School Holiday Foods fund #5466. Thank you!

Our expenses for November totaled \$27,374.93 with a yearly total of \$256,517.06 which is 99.4% of our budget.

The difference of income to expenses for the first 11 months of the year is \$-26,150.61 compared to last month difference of \$-19,983.70. Once again we had enough money in our checking account for cash flow because of the capital campaign funds.

Our checking/savings account balance in our main account shown on the balance sheet is \$109,040.46. This includes the capital campaign, youth, outreach and the Pastor's Liberia Mission Trip funds.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$6,834.17.

At the December 4th Stewardship Breakfast the congregation approved the proposed 2023 budget. It includes a 5.15% increase in expenses which incorporates a 3% salary increase for our staff. It also includes a .92% increase in income. We approved a deficit budget of -\$4,006.

Next month's newsletter will have our 2022 year-end financial report so I'll be able to tell you more then on just how we ended our year financially. We will also have your year-end statement ready before the end of January.

Let me know if you have any questions. I hope you have great start to 2023!

Rica to develop fraternal relationships and assist with ministry projects. She also works with Nicaraguan immigrant women, many of whom are dealing with situations of domestic violence, at the same time they are starting over again in a new country. Sue provides assistance with issues such as legalizing their status, housing, skill-training and education as well as providing emotional and spiritual support for these women and their children.






