

#### From the Pastor's Desk in Africa:

ABWM SPECIAL PROJECT 2022-2023: American Baptist Women's

Ministries of the Central Region (ABWMCR) will be the Antioch Baptist School Monrovia, in Liberia, Africa. Jessa and I visited this past week to encourage students, take photographs, and share updates on the project. West Side Baptist Church's ABWM women will receive donations for this year's project in Liberia, Africa.



**FROM THE ABWMCR WEBSITE:** Multiple factors – historic, cultural, and even relatively recent national civil wars and health epidemics (Ebola and COVID-19) – have conspired to disrupt the educational system in Liberia, to the point of putting Liberian children (and adults, too!) at a crippling disadvantage in terms of adequate education and access to appropriate resources. Antioch Baptist Church is endeavoring to stand in the gap by seeking to provide quality education for children and young people – to improve the learning environment for close to one-hundred-fifty students, who have been meeting in cramped quarters, or outside, when the weather permits. Majority of the students are still meeting in cramped spaces (some classes combined) or under trees, where



they are at the mercy of the elements, including frequent tropical thunderstorms during the rainy season, which lasts half the year!

In the 2021-2022 school year, Antioch Baptist Elementary and Junior High School had 146 students – 69 female and 79 male; and 24 teachers and staff – 9 female and 15 male.

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### **CONTINUED FROM PASTOR'S DESK**



**PAST BUILDING PROJECTS**—In the 2021-2022 school year, Antioch Baptist Elementary and Junior High School had 146 students – 69 female and 79 male; and 24 teachers and staff – 9 female and 15 male.

One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS) grants and local resources have resulted in the construction of the ground and first floors of a four-floor school building – providing eight classrooms. This is attracting additional students – which in turn creates a need for more space! A good "problem" to have.

International Ministries has partnered with the Liberia Direct Baptist Missionary Conference since 2000; and we have prioritized this school building project out of our mutual commitment to the dignity, liberation, and productive citizenship that require a solid educational foundation and nurture.

**HOW WE WILL HELP!** A grant of USD \$30,000 will provide for the construction of the second floor of the building – bringing the building to three-fourth completion of construction! This is critical to the long-term vision of upgrading the school to include Senior High grades and vocational training classes, thus enhancing its relevance to the local community and the nation. Completion of the construction will serve as leverage and motivation to secure funding for finishes and furnishings for this second floor – desks, chairs, tables, boards, plumbing, etc.



**COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT** - This project has significant ownership and involvement from the community: local volunteers are critical to keeping costs down. A collaboration between parents, the community, the local church (which owns the school and is a member of the Liberia Direct Baptist Missionary Conference), and the national Ministry of Education will ensure a supply of qualified teachers and administrators. The impact of the school and church is noticed in the fact that the community is now being called the Antioch Community!

Jessa and I will have lots of stories to share and information about the Antioch Baptist Church school and convention center project, as well as fabulous clothes given to us by our new African friends at the Liberia Baptist Theological Seminary.

The need is great!!! So, please give generously – and sacrificially - to the ABWM project!

Many Liberians have great pride in the nations connection to the United States. Liberia is the oldest, independent republic in Africa.

# **TREASURER'S REPORT**

We had a remarkable year financially. Throughout 2022, we spent only \$189.54 over our income. We had expenses not planned and yet our congregation continues to be generous in their gifts. Thank you.

Our income for December was \$51,287.05 for a total of \$281,653.50 for the year. We exceeded our 2022 budget by \$16,723.50.

Our expenses for December totaled \$25,117.34 for a year-end total of \$281,843.04 which was \$23,776.04 over what we budgeted for 2022.

Our checking/savings account balance in our main account was \$115,598.93. This includes the capital campaign, youth, outreach and Liberia Mission Trip funds.

The Benevolent Fund balance at year-end was \$6,834.17.

Ongoing Program Balances at year-end to carry forward into 2023 are:

Youth Fund balance to carry forward is \$3,858.85.

Just like many of you who have investment accounts, we had a loss in our investments. Overall we lost nearly \$90,000 throughout 2022. We paid a total of \$4,653.80 in investment/advisory fees in 2022.

The 2022 year-end individual giving statements have been distributed. If you did not get yours, please let either Nelda Janway or me know. Also, after you review your giving statement, please contact me if you have any questions. If you would like more information on your designated giving, I would be glad to print you a detailed report.

The 2023 tithing envelopes have been distributed. Anyone not receiving envelopes but would like to use them, please check with Nelda or me. Any envelopes you have left over from 2022 or before should be thrown away. Thanks.

Be sure to review the 2022 Annual Report. We have provided the year-end finance reports, the capital campaign reports and the approved 2023 budget.

Another year has begun, and we have hit the ground running! Each year brings new challenges, new experiences, and often many new blessings for Doorstep! We are looking at having the Doorstep Annual Banquet & Quilt Drawing this year after a 3-year COVID hiatus; perhaps a food sale, and the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Neighbor Helping Neighbor Walk/5K Fun Run will be Sunday, October 1<sup>st</sup>!

As always we know we could not do all of our services and activities without the help of our member congregations, volunteers, and the community! We have been here over 56 years, and we still operate on "neighbors helping neighbors"!

**Super Bowl Sunday is February 12<sup>th,</sup>** and we are asking our member congregations to collect soup and crackers again this year to help stock our food pantry! Watch for sales, and gather your donations! We can use all varieties of soup, and crackers. A successful Super Bowl Sunday can stock our pantry with these items into the spring months! <u>Our goal for 2023 is 5,000 pounds = 2.5 ton</u>!

We have decided going forward we will no longer give out clothing and shoes in our Christmas Adoption Project. We will continue to use the distribution model we started due to COVID, and provide gift cards in lieu of clothing. <u>The only exceptions are</u>: NEW pajamas for kids, and NEW hoodies for men, women, and teens... As winter clearance sales are going on, look for warm pajamas from newborn to sizes 18 for kids (boys & girls), and hoodies (sweatshirts) in all sizes, colors, sports teams etc. (sizes small – 5x)

Finally, **Thank You** to everyone who donated money, blankets, games, puzzles, gifts, school supplies, hygiene items, and their time for **Doorstep's Christmas Adoption Project** this past December! We assisted a total of **260 households with 822 individuals!**

### **Notification of Cross Wind Sale**

On December 20th, 2022, a journey came to an end. On October 17th, 1991, the American Baptist Churches of the Central Region purchased 31 acres on the east side of Hesston, Kansas. To this they added an additional 80 acres for a total of 111 acres. This property became known as Cross Wind Camp and Conference Center. The American Baptist Churches of the Central Region began to develop the grounds and broke ground to build the Mabee Center on May 4, 1996. Construction of the Judson and Williams retreat lodges began in April of 1997. The Meredith lodge was added in 1998.

Throughout the years, Cross Wind has become many things to many people in the Central Region. It has been a summer camp for many of our children and a place for meditation for many adults. Cross Wind has hosted many conferences including the Annual Gathering of the American Baptists of the Central Region. Many family reunions and parties have been held at Cross Wind, many of them repeating over the years.

In 2019 Cross Wind began to experience some financial difficulties and made the difficult decision to sell the director's house at the entrance to the property in hopes that the funds realized from the sale would help Cross Wind's financial situation. It did, but only temporarily. The board of directors had some hard discussions, but ultimately came to the decision to explore the sale of the property. With the advent of the COVID pandemic, the decision was made to fully pursue selling the Cross Wind property. A contract for sale was signed in May of 2022 to sell the Cross Wind property to Camp David International. On December 20th, 2022, the sale of Cross Wind closed, and the journey came to an end.

But as with all things with God, when one journey ends, another one begins. The sale of Cross Wind will bring approximately \$200,000 into the Central Region. These funds can be used to begin new ministries within the region that can reach more people with the Good News of the Kingdom of Heaven.

The board of directors of the Central Region Camp and Conference Corporation wish to thank all the members of the Central Region for your thoughts, prayers and donations of your time and treasure over the past 31 years. Please pray for the Central Region. Pray that God's Will will be done and that through the use of the funds from the sale of the Cross Wind property, many people, young and old will turn the lives over to the King of kings and Lord of lords, Jesus Christ. The board also asks that you find a place in your prayers for the ministry of Camp David International as they bring the love of God to the children of incarcerated parents.






