

From the Pastor's Desk:

Jesus never celebrated Lent. He did not eat fish on Fridays. He did not wear ashes on his forehead on Ash Wednesday. He didn't sing dirges in worship to mark a season of sorrow, sadness, or shame.

Lent is a liturgical season created by the church to help Jesus' followers reflect upon his life and ministry. It is designed Christians and physically and spiritually identify with the real struggles of Jesus found in the Gospels. Lent is modeled after the 40 days Jesus was in the desert being tempted



by the evil one as preparation for his public ministry and eventual journey to the Cross of Calvary (Mt 4:1-11). The story is not about us, it's about JESUS! It is a story of triumph - Jesus defeated the devil as God's one and only perfect, sinless Son, so he could offer himself as a saving sacrifice. It's about him identifying with our human condition.

A good Lent should not be a time to test or tempt ourselves. We should not create artificial suffering to prove our strength or devotion. The focus of all religious festivals and seasons should be on JESUS! Jesus was tempted and therefore knows our moral and spiritual struggles. *He defeated the devil,* so he can give us *his* spiritual power to overcome evil. Jesus spent time in prayer, so we can call upon his help in our hour of need. Lent should be focused on Jesus—a time to renew our faith, trust, hope, and love of Jesus.

As we celebrate the season of Lent, lets focus our spiritual practices and devotion on Jesus: HE overcome evil. He gives us STRENGTH when we are weak. HE loves us in spite of our failures. HE sacrificed himself so we can be saved. HE is the great overcomer! May this Lent be a time for your to renew your love of JESUS!

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our Church Finances

We are a generous church. We started 2023 with a healthy year-end balance from 2022 of \$140,600.55. Much of that is designated for our capital campaign, outreach and youth funds but we can feel good about not having to dip into our investment funds to cash flow any of last year.

Our income for January was \$17,837.45. This is 6.67% of our budget. 1/12 of the budget year is 8.33%. Our January income included the annual distribution of \$7,974 from our Topeka Community Foundation main fund. The distribution from the Vern and Portia Allbert estate gift designated for music will not be distributed until this summer.

Our expenses for January totaled \$19,993.14 which is 7.23% of our budget. The difference of income to expenses for the first month of the year is -\$2,155.69.

Our checking account balance at the end of January is \$132,160.53. A large portion of this balance is the Capital Campaign monies totaling \$70,848.76 and Outreach totaling \$8,570.45.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$7,265.17.

The Long Range Planning Committee (Harry Carpenter, Tom Mansfield, Clarence Payne, Nathan Poe, Pastor Ivan Greuter and Nancy Lindberg) will be meeting soon to determine what projects will be on our list to accomplish in 2023. You can look at our 2022 Annual Report to review what was completed in the first year of the 3-year campaign and what projects are still on the list for 2023 and 2024. Feel free to talk with any of us if you have a preference on which project is next.


