



TREASURER'S REPORT

Our Church Finances

Our income for April was \$46,747.61. The total to date for the year is \$99,903.85 and is 37.37% of our budget.

Our expenses for April were \$20,927.71 compared to \$36,617.78 in March for total expenses from first of the year through April of \$99,163.13. This is 36.09% of the budget. Expense items to note include: \$976.86 ($\frac{1}{2}$ of \$1,953.72) payment to McElroy's for a maintenance contract and \$495 for new toilets in several restrooms.

The difference of income to expenses through April is \$740.72.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$136,174.07. A large portion of our balance is in the Capital Campaign and Outreach funds.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$8,027.25.

At the March council meeting we approved a memorials expense for a new lap top computer for the pastor. Brice Smith purchased the computer for \$2,699. The Memorials Committee (Alice Payne, Bev McCurdy, Molly Morris and Nancy Lindberg) is recommending we use the following memorials funds: \$396 – Bill Merrifield; \$1,205 – Jim Lagerberg; and the remaining \$1,098 from Rogene Moody's memorial.


At the May council meeting the council asked the Memorials Committee to review memorial funds and recommend which funds to purchase a monitor off the balcony and for new Baptist hymnals. The committee will meet and will report back.

To date we have received \$2,790 in memorial gifts in Harry Carpenter's memory.







ALICE & CLARENCE PAYNE

Our Friends story this month features one of our special and dynamite couples, Clarence and Alice Payne. In the dictionary a dynamite person (couple) is someone full of energy with exciting ideas and these two seem to fit that ticket. Clarence serves on the Capital Campaign Committee, oversees the ushers, and recently completed his term as Property Chair and as Personnel Chair. He is also temporarily filling the position of Administration after Harry Carpenter passed away. Years ago when West Side had a men's fast pitch softball team, Clarence was the pitcher extraordinaire. You can see several of the team's trophies displayed in the room off the southeast corner of the sanctuary.



Alice serves on the Memorials Committee, teaches 4th & 5th graders at WWW (Wonderful Wednesdays at West Side) and works in the Baby's Closet. Both of them plan and prepare the Wednesday night meals for WWW. Whew! They are busy.

Clarence was born in Perry. He was the youngest of five boys. He has one brother Bill still living. He moved to North Topeka when he was ten living above the Western Auto Store. In the late 1950's they moved to the Tecumseh area. He became a 5th grade classmate and friend to his future wife Alice. Clarence told me he had his first date with Alice the summer before their 9th grade. He played and loved all sports and also spent time fishing with his brothers, dad and stepdad. He was baptized when he was young and recommitted to Christ being baptized by West Side Baptist pastor Doug Beyer in 1977.

Clarence graduated from high school in 1967. He worked nights and the summers at Jayhawk Tower as auditor and manager of the hotel. He joined the Air Force on Valentine's Day in 1968 and went to basic training in Lackland, Texas. He then served in an isolated and remote area of Turkey for one year before coming home and marrying the love of his life Alice in 1969. He stayed in the service stationed at Forbes until June 1972.

One of their first homes was at 314 Clay which is down the street from West Side Baptist Church where church member Alice Kieffer currently lives. In 1978 they built a home in Tecumseh.

In November 1975 Clarence started helping his father-in-law occasionally who owned and operated Capital Mail Service. In November 1975 he purchased the mail service which doesn't

compete with the post office but provides delivery service to/from companies in the Topeka area. His clients included such businesses as Security Benefit, Evergy and Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway. He sold the business in 2021.

Alice was born in Topeka and has a big brother Bob who lives in Texas and a little sister Betty who we know as Betty Arnold. They grew up in the Quinton Heights area of Topeka. Her neighbors were several West Side Baptist families - the Mays, Lundgrens and Wikstens. Although her family attended West Side Christian Church, the neighborhood kids were going to Bible School at their church so Alice went along and was nurtured by the members of West Side Baptist. Alice was baptized when she was 8 or 9 years old. Later when she and Clarence lived in this neighborhood, their neighbors Earl and Dorothy Davis were members of West Side Baptist and Earl invited them to go with him to church after Dorothy passed away. Right away Alice recognized former neighbors and friends she knew from her early days attending Bible School. West Side became their church home!

After high school graduation in 1967 Alice began college at KU but, after getting married and starting a family, she transferred to Washburn taking classes part time. She received her Bachelor's from Washburn in 1975 and while teaching she studied at KU getting her Master's in 1980. Alice taught various grades in Shawnee Heights at Berryton School for 32 years. After retiring she continued her teaching by substituting on and off for 10 years in her son Chris' kindergarten class in Manhattan.

Alice and Clarence are grateful for all their blessings. Most important to them is family. Alice and Clarence have two sons. Their oldest is Chris who is married to Amy and lives in Manhattan. Next is Matt who is married to Brooke and lives in Kansas City, Missouri. Both sons have four children. Chris was a school teacher and now owns a child care business and Amy is an occupational therapist with the Manhattan School system. Amy is also Nancy Lindberg's niece. It was Alice and Nancy who first played matchmaker for Chris and Amy the summer that Amy was living with Nancy. Their son Matt is a sergeant on a tactical team for the KCMO Police Department and Brooke is a registered nurse. But we can't forget their four-legged family. They have two mini Australian Shepherds – Apache and Wrangler. You may hear Sonia Roling talk about them because she dog sits on occasion.




UNITY IN THE TRINITY JUNE 4, 2023


