LAST SUNDAY CINEMA - Our last movie for the summer is Belle and Sebastian. It is a 2013 French adventure drama based on the 1966 French novel *Belle et Sebastien* by Cecile Aubry.

The movie is set in 1943 when France was occupied by Germany. Sebastian is a seven-year-old orphan boy living with Caesar, an adoptive "Grandfather" and his niece, Angelina. The unusual little family lives in the small village of Saint-Martin, whose inhabitants, despite the German occupation, secretly organize the passage of Jewish exiles into Switzerland. The village is plagued by a mysterious "Beast" who preys on the flocks of the shepherds and the inhabitants. Though Belle and Sebastian is not a true story, the Pyrenees did, in fact, serve as an escape route for many European Jews escaping Nazi persecution, many of whom were aided by non -Jewish citizens who risked their lives to help them.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our Church Finances

Where has the time gone? We are already halfway through the year and our finances are doing pretty well. Our income for June was \$15,574.30. The total to date for the year is \$130,231.02 and is 48.71% of what we budgeted. $\frac{1}{2}$ of the year is 50.0%. Income to note includes: \$60 for Vacation Bible School and \$25 for Blessing Boxes.

Our expenses for June were \$23,697.79 for total expenses from first of the year through June of \$149,213.95. This is 54.3% of the budget. Expense items to note include: \$500.00 in M&M Pension for Office Manager; \$4,229.54 in Building Facility Maintenance for tree removal (\$2,100) and McElroy's contract (\$985); and \$206.51 for Vacation Bible School/Summer Program. Note also that Utilities - Electricity increased by almost \$500 in June but Gas decreased by almost \$350.

The difference of income to expenses through June is - \$18,982.93.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$117,409.79 compared to \$131,157.94 last month. A large portion of our balance is in the Capital Campaign and Outreach funds.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$6,291.96.

In July we received our annual distribution from the Vern and Portial Allbert fund at the Topeka Community Foundation. This year the amount was \$3,905.00. This gift offsets our music related budget expenditures.

You should have received your 2nd quarter giving statement. If you didn't get yours, please let Nelda Janway, Nancy Ohse or me know and we'll get you one printed.

Thank you for your continued financial support of our church. As a whole, we are a financially healthy church with generous givers. Let me know if you have any questions.

GETTING TO KNOW OUR CHURCH FRIENDS

Our Friends story this month features two remarkable women of our church, **Trena Ansell and Molly Morris**. Several days after my interview with Trena she passed away from heart problems. Her Celebration of Life service will be Saturday, August 5th at 10:00 a.m. at West Side Baptist Church.

Trena Ansell joined West Side Baptist in 1985. For years she organized our Women's Night Out dinner group eating out once a month with any women of the church who wanted to go. The men started eating out the same night and sometimes even chose the same location as the ladies. Trena chose our location and provided reminders until Covid



put an end to the program, at least for a while. Until recently she also headed up the nursery, volunteering to watch the little ones and asking others to serve. She still makes sure there are enough supplies in the nursery and typically donates what is needed. For years Trena has organized a group of church women who enjoy live theatre to attend Topeka Civic Theatre productions together.

Ann Maria "Trena" Ansell was born in Savannah, Georgia. She has one older brother Bill Abrams, and two younger sisters Joanie Peterson and Puddy Nuzzo. Puddy passed away in 2017. Trena told me she was dedicated as a baby in the church of her grandmother, the United Brethren Church, and then attended the Presbyterian Church. Later she started attending the local Baptist Church where she was baptized.

At an early age Trena's family moved to Bradford, Pennsylvania and that is where she met the man she would later marry, Fred Ansell. In high school they loved going to school dances on Friday nights. They graduated from Bradford Area High School in 1963. Trena decided to attend Buffalo University to become a nurse but only studied there for one year. Fred was attending Eastern Baptist College so after they were married in July of 1966, she joined him. They later moved to Covina, California where Fred continued his studies and received both his Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry from American Baptist Seminary of the West. Trena cared for their first child Jennifer "Jennie" and for several years they were house parents for 6-10 kids at the Masonic Home for Children.

In 1972, they moved to Hays, Kansas for Fred to become Campus Minister at Fort Hays State and for Trena to begin her studies to become a speech pathologist. She completed her Bachelor of Science and Master of Science Degrees in Speech Communication. During that time their son Aaron was born. In 1978, they moved to Pittsburg, Kansas for Fred to become the Southeast Area Minister for American Baptist for the Central Region (ABCCR) and for Trena to start her career as a speech pathologist in the Pittsburg School District. They enjoyed traveling to Fred's meetings around the country and spending many a Christmas with family in Tucson, Arizona. Also, they enjoyed hosting international high school and college exchange students from Japan, Nicaragua and Columbia.

In 1985, they moved to Topeka for Fred to serve as Executive Director of ABCCR and for Trena to become the speech pathologist for the Three Lakes Special Education Cooperative. She retired in 2006 and Fred in 2007. They loved spending more time with their wonderful grandchildren: Micah (Aaron and Jillinda's daughter) and Chris (Jennie and Bob's son). Trena treasures spending almost every Saturday with Micah and then having dinner with Aaron and Jillinda. She is delighted visiting Jennie and Bob in their home in Milford especially on holidays. Trena loved reading especially science fiction and using her talents for cardmaking. If you step inside her craft room you would think she has her own shop. Almost every Tuesday, Tom and Jan Mansfield visit Trena so Jan can make a new card that Trena has practiced making during the week. Maybe you have received one of those homemade cards!

Trena loved their many trips abroad. She told me her favorite country was France but I know she also enjoyed England where they visited Jennie when she lived outside of London. Since Fred's death from ALS in 2012, Trena continued traveling to see family and friends. She also traveled every fall to Branson with me to see several shows and to make Christmas cards.

Our next West Side Baptist Friend featured this month is **Molly Morris**. Molly joined our church in 1987. She heads up our prayer chain program which includes not only getting messages out on people who need our prayers but also serves as captain of the team (Nancy Cottril, Marty Rosa Stevenson and Pat Carreno) who send cards to the shut-ins and others in the church. Molly has served on many committees over the years – Fellowship, Nominating, Personnel and Pulpit Committee when Pastor Kip Mickelson was called to serve. She enjoyed singing in the choir and teaching WWW.

Molly was born in Lebo, Kansas. She has a sister, Roxie, who is three years older, and had a brother, Billy, who died when he was 6 weeks old. Her family lived in Melvern, Lyndon and then in 1945 moved to Topeka when her Dad went to work for Goodyear. Molly's

mother was a homemaker. They attended First Congregational Church and later an interdenominational church. Molly graduated from Topeka High School.

After high school Molly decided to attend Clark's School of Business but after six months she was hired to work at Goodyear in the whitewall tire area. Molly told me she met Don "in the tunnel" when she would be walking to get their office mail at Goodyear and Don was going the opposite direction because he also worked at Goodyear. Don eventually called her to ask her out and the rest is history. They were married on May 2, 1959. Don served in the Army (6 months training) and then went into the Reserves and National Guard. Molly was laid off at Goodyear when they went on strike and she worked for Ray Beers Clothing in downtown Topeka.

In March of 1960 Don and Molly bought a farm three miles northeast of Holton. In 1967, they decided to build a milk barn and to start a dairy farm. Molly quit work to help Don with the milking and their kids helped too. They have four children: Polly Millican (Jerry), Penny Frey (Mike), Randy Morris (Julie) and Bruce Morris (Kathy). The girls are twins. They milked 65-70 cows twice a day. Molly enjoyed their country life! During these years on the farm they were members of Holton's First Baptist Church.

In 1979, they had a bad fire in the hay barn. There was nothing they could do to save it and that meant they lost the hay that was needed to feed the cows. Molly said that Don, realizing their great loss, used his sense of humor during the fire saying, "Want to have a wiener roast"? They sold the cows and both got jobs in Topeka – Don working at Midwest Machine Works and Molly at Volume Shoes. Don also patched roofs on the side. Showbiz Pizza knew of Don's work and approached him to work for them as they were expanding to 12 new locations in the East and in Texas. Showbiz also asked him to research Duro-Last Roofing which ultimately became the roofing material that made them successful. Midwest Coating Inc. was born! They sold the farm and by 1981 were traveling across the country installing Duro-Last Roofs for the 12 Showbiz Pizza locations. It was just Molly and another couple working with Don putting on the roofs.

In 1985, they moved to Topeka and Don became the Sales Representative for Duro-Last Roofing for Kansas, Nebraska and Oklahoma. They visited several churches including West Side Baptist and they felt "our church members were so friendly". They met George and Dorothy Robinson and it was George who invited them to Sunday School. Molly recognized Max Bloom and they realized they were neighbors of Wayne and Nancy Cottril. They had a new church home!

Besides their four children, Molly and Don have 10 grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren. Don passed away in June 2020 from colon cancer. They enjoyed 61 years together!

Molly loves to read, likes to cook, and enjoys lunch with friends. She especially likes live theatre (she's in Trena's group) and going to movies. She and Don had tremendous experiences traveling to work conventions across the country and also enjoyed trips abroad to France and England.

Molly closed my interview with this statement, "We gave our business to the Lord and we can see how greatly He blessed us. Glory to God for giving me Don and our business!" ~ Nancy Lindberg

I nudged Jesus, 'What's the deal? I would love to hear Your take. How'd all these sinners get up here? God must've made a mistake.!


And why's everyone so quiet, So somber - give me a clue.' 'Hush, child,' He said, 'they're all in shock. No one thought they'd be seeing you.
