From the Pastor's Desk: "WHERE ARE WE GOING?"

What is God's vision for His church? Where is God moving among us? Where is God leading us? It is essential that we reflect upon the vision that God has for His church. Our journey as a congregation is not a mere coincidence, but a divine calling orchestrated by the Almighty. As we pray and discern the movement of the Holy Spirit, let us try to glimpse God's profound vision for His church at West Side Baptist Church.

Three scriptures come to mind when I think of our purpose:

(1) "There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all" Ephesians 4:4-6 (ESV). In these verses, the apostle Paul highlights the unity that God desires in the church. Our diversity in gifts, backgrounds, and experiences should serve as a witness to the richness of God's creation. We are bound together by a common faith in the one Lord. God's vision for His church involves unity amidst diversity, where we come together as one body,

driven by the same Spirit, united by our common baptism, and guided by the hope of our calling.

(2) "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations. baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obev everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the

very end of the age" Matthew 28:19-20 (NIV). Known as the Great Commission, these verses reveal God's heart for evangelism and discipleship. He calls us to go beyond the comfort of our church walls and share the transformative message of His love with the world. The vision God has for His church encompasses spreading the Gospel, making disciples, and nurturing them in His teachings. We are not just a congregation that gathers; we are a body commissioned to bring His light to every corner of the earth.

(3) "All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer" Acts 2:42 (NLT). The early church in Acts provides a model of devotion and community that God envisions for His church. We are called to be a family, supporting and uplifting one another. The church is not merely a place to attend on Sundays but a community where believers strengthen their faith through learning, fellowship, breaking bread together, and fervent prayer. God's vision for His church involves a deep connection among its members, a bond that reflects His love and care.

As we gather on Friday and Saturday, September 1-2, to discern when God is inviting us to join His future, let us mediate on these scriptures. *Everyone is needed! Everyone is welcome!* Let us remember that God's vision for His church is not just a call to busy acts of service and humanitarian work but an invitation to *be the people of God*. Together, we can fulfill God's vision and be a beacon of His light in a world that longs for hope and meaning. *Plan now to join us for this important time of spiritual searching and discernment!*

TREASURER'S REPORT

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for July was \$21,326.55. The total to date for the year is \$151,558.09 and is 56.69% of our budget. 7/12 of the year is 58.3%. Income to note includes: \$3,905 in #4152 Topeka Community Foundation for the annual Portia and Vern Allbert estate distribution and \$330 in #5465 School Supplies donations.

Our expenses for July were \$28,874.33 for total expenses from first of the year through July of \$179,073.59. This is 65.17% of the budget. Expense items to note include: \$340.38 in #7140 Mission Education (Missionary Tea); \$328.05 in #7540 Technology Operations (Annual renewal of Microsoft); \$828.42 in #7625 Office Operations (Sam's Club Membership, Ring Door Bell protection plan and Adobe computer programs); \$6,941.31 in #7710 Building Facility Maintenance (air conditioner freon leak); and \$144.06 (worship planning) in #8530 Music Resources. We also had an expected increase in our Electricity bill. And, #8685 Youth Fund Expenditures of \$2,286.37 was the expenditure of our youth and sponsors to the Quest Conference in Green Lake, Wisconsin. This line item expenditure will be transferred to come out of the youth fundraising account which currently has a balance of \$3.613.82.

The difference of income to expenses through July is - \$27,515.50.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$115.000.11 compared to \$117,409.79 last month. A large portion of our balance is in the Capital Campaign and Outreach funds.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$6,291.96.



GETTING TO KNOW OUR CHURCH FRIENDS



Our Friends story this month features a couple who have been long-time church members and yet, we don't see them in the main part of the sanctuary on Sunday mornings. One is busy running the video system in the balcony and the other one also sits upstairs. Who am I writing about? **Tom and Jan Mansfield**! In the 1950's Tom was brought to our church by his mother, **Virginia Mansfield**, who is also a member, and Jan joined in 1970 soon after she started dating Tom.

Jan was born and raised on a farm north of Beloit, Kansas. She is a single child but was fortunate to not only live with her parents but also both sets of grandparents were nearby on adjoining farmland. Jan's dad was a wheat farmer and rancher and her mother was a farm wife. Jan loved all sports but softball was her favorite. She took piano lessons for a number of years and played the clarinet in the band at Jewel High School. After graduating in 1967,

Jan headed to Topeka to the Stormont Vail School of Nursing graduating from their program in 1970. It was when she was in nursing school that one of her classmates, Paul Palmer, introduced her to his friend, Tom Mansfield. Jan and Tom dated more than a year before being married in our church by Doug Beyer in 1971.

Jan's work career included working for Stormont Vail on the Post-Surgical floor and then in Surgery. She then decided to work for the Shawnee County Health Department as a Public Health Nurse. Her favorite work was next when she was the "village nurse" for Aldersgate. It was then she decided that she wanted to enhance her nursing career by studying at Washburn earning her Bachelor of Science degree. Upon graduation she worked for Dr. Tom Hamilton in his practice until she got sick in 2001. Jan came down with viral encephalitis, a brain infection, that caused her to be hospitalized and it ended her nursing career. The infection impacted the memory parts of her brain causing her to still suffer with memory issues.

Growing up, Jan went to a Methodist Church with her mom but when she met Tom in Topeka she attended and then was baptized at West Side Baptist.

Jan and Tom have two sons, Dan and Mark. They both live in the Kansas City area and they both are chemical engineers. Dan was born in 1977 and is married to Amy and has one child, Emma. Mark was born in 1980. Both boys were brought up at West Side Baptist and when they were young Jan did not work but enjoyed being at home with them. She volunteered at their school, Tecumseh South, and in later years enjoyed volunteering at Tecumseh North. At West Side over the years Jan has been a children's program volunteer, a worker in the nursery, helped with many dinners and even substituted playing the piano for Sunday worship.

Jan is very artistic. At a young age she enjoyed crafting with her mother. They did quilling and other crafts. If you visit our church nursery you can enjoy some of Jan's artistic paintings on the hallway and room walls. She and Trena Ansell shared in their love of cardmaking and would meet weekly for years using their creative skills making beautiful cards. Jan also sews and in the past sewed some of her own clothes.

Tom was born in Elkhart, Indiana when his mom and dad were visiting family but was brought up in Topeka. He first lived in our church neighborhood on Grove Street and would attend West Side Baptist. He remembers Dick and Hazel May encouraging him to come. Tom had three siblings – Phil who was a year older, Jerry who is three years younger and a little sister Nancy who is six years younger. Phil is the only one who has passed away.

Tom's mother, Virginia, is a member and loves West Side Baptist. She has many friends in the church but



has not been able to attend recently. She currently lives in the Brewster Assisted Living Memory Care Unit. Virginia was born in Topeka and attended a Pentecostal Church in her early years. But after marrying and living in the neighborhood, she brought up her four children at West Side Baptist. Virginia got her cosmetology license and worked for a while as a beautician but realized how hard it was to build up a clientele. She then became an aide at the State Hospital and then became an aide at the Veteran's Administration (VA) Hospital. It was from the VA that she retired. Virginia loved sewing and canning.
