2024 LIBERIA AFRICA MISSION TRIP – The Church Council voted unanimously to approve the request from International Ministries (IM) for Pastor Ivan to return to the Liberia Baptist Theological Seminary in West Africa to teach classes next January 8-31, 2024. He will be teaching two classes: (1) The Writings of the Apostle Paul, and (2) Biblical Foundations of Missions.

The Rev. Art Campbell agreed to serve as the Pastor in Residence next January. The church pays no costs for pastor's service work with International Ministries.





TREASURER'S REPORT

Our Church Finances

Our income for September was \$21,880.02. The total to date for the year is \$207,403.70 and is 77.58% of our budget. 9/12 of the year is 75.0%.

Our expenses for September were \$23,871.54 for total expenses from first of the year through September of \$220,660.26. This is 80.31% of the budget. Expense items to note include: #7530 Facility Operations - \$1,282.78 for vacuum motor; #7625 Office Operations - \$1,248.53 for postage, envelopes and office supplies; #9550 Capital Campaign Expenses - \$1,110 for a \$1,000 donation to the NE Area Liberia Poultry and Piggery Project and \$110 for elevator expense.

The difference of income to expenses through September is -\$13,256.56.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$127,047.37. A large portion of our balance is in the Capital Campaign and Outreach funds.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$6,291.96.

The council members have been working with me on preparing a 2024 church budget. We will provide you a recommended proposed budget in November and it will be voted on at **our December 3rd All-Church Breakfast Meeting**. Please plan to attend and help us decide on our church finances for 2024.



The Long Range Planning Committee met recently and decided which capital campaign projects to work on next. The re-striping of the parking lot and repair and painting of the sanctuary are the next projects. As chair of the committee, I encourage you to continue your commitment to our 3-year \$300,000 Fortifying our Foundation for the Future Campaign. We are almost through our 2nd year of the campaign and I hope you're keeping up with your pledge. I will be continuing to talk more about the campaign throughout the month of November.

GETTING TO KNOW OUR CHURCH FRIENDS

Our Friends story this month features Marianne Spano. Marianne has been a member of



West Side Baptist since the early 1970's. Over the years she has been the church clerk, a Sunday School teacher, volunteer for the baby closet and a leader with the American Baptist Women's Ministries (ABWM).

Marianne was born in Waterville, Kansas, which is about 40 miles north of Manhattan. She is the youngest of nine children. Her dad was a farmer with cattle and her mom an elementary school teacher. She accepted Jesus in 8th grade and was baptized in the Lutheran Church in Waterville. Marianne was baptized again when she became a member of West Side Baptist.

After graduating from high school in 1957, Marianne decided to continue living at home to help care for an aunt who had special needs and was living with them.

But in 1962 with the encouragement of a sister, she moved to Topeka to attend Clark's Business School. She received her certificate of completion and began working at the Kansas State Teacher's Association with their Reading Circle program for four years. Then she took a position with the State of Kansas Board of Agriculture for several years before going to work at the Kansas Dental Board for 21 years. With this work she licensed dentists and hygienists, giving them their tests, and did other clerical work. She retired in June 1999.

I asked Marianne what led her to start attending West Side Baptist when she was living in Topeka and she said that she searched for a church home for several years and then a friend asked her to go with him to West Side Baptist. She felt welcomed and believed she found her church family.

Marianne enjoys growing flowers, rescuing pets, being a good neighbor, visiting shut-ins and exercising...especially walking and doing work-outs with Jane Fonda tapes. She broke her knee years ago and it healed wrong causing her to have one leg shorter and not being

as physically active as she would like to be.


Although Marianne is divorced with no children, she has become an incredible caregiver and friend to so many. Her church family always sees the love and care she has for everyone. She visits our shut-ins, provides rides to those who need one and has always been one to help with the various programs of our church. Marianne has a great memory and easily recalls former pastors' sermons and Sunday School lessons. I am one who is amazed at her

recollection of church events of the past. Marianne shared with me that she misses hearing her nickname Squealer given to her by The Cookie Snatcher, Don Morris. She loves her church family!

In 1999 Marianne volunteered for AmeriCorps in Topeka. She was assigned to be part of their respite caregiver program which provided caregivers to disabled people in their homes. Not only did she work with the caregivers but she also on occasion relieved some of them by serving in their place. After 9/11 in 2001 she worked in the caregiving program as part of Midland Hospice and then made a decision to work with someone in need in Harveyville



which was outside the area for Midland so she went out on her own in Wabaunsee County working as companions for people with dementia and recovering from strokes or cancer for another 11 years.

For 25 years Marianne was a member of the Pilot Club of Topeka whose members volunteered in the community to make a difference. They worked with people with brain injuries and other illnesses and did fundraising for Alzheimer's. It was a club near and dear to Marianne's heart. Although Pilot Club of Topeka no longer exists, it is still an active program internationally.

I'll close with Marianne's favorite scriptures she shared with me including reciting several lines from Psalm 91: 2, 4, and 14 – I will say of the Lord, "He is my refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust." He will cover you with his feathers and under his wings you will find refuge; "Because he loves me," says the Lord.

Hebrews 11:1 – Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see.

Luke 10:27 – Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind, and, love your neighbor as yourself.

Fortifying Our Foundation for the Future Capital Campaign Update



In late 2021, we launched a three-year \$300,000 capital campaign after needs were assessed and suggestions solicited from the congregation. We committed 10% of the monies raised for missions (1/3 international, 1/3 national/regional and 1/3 local missions). 21 projects were started on a "pay as we go" basis.

As we approach the end of our second year of the campaign, we want to recognize what we've accomplished and what is still on our list to be done. It is also important for

us to think about our own commitment to the campaign, what pledge you made nearly two years ago, and ask yourself if my pledge has been paid and/or is there something more you can do. For those in our congregation who are new, we ask you to consider making your pledge or gift to the campaign.
