TREASURER'S REPORT

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for October was \$13,193.85. The total to date for the year is \$211,320.99 and is 83.82% of our budget. 10/12 of the year is 83.3%.

Our expenses for October were \$21,940.65 for total expenses from first of the year through October of \$242,530.04. This is 88.27% of the budget. Expense items this month to note include: #7625 Office Operations - \$2,308.51 for copier monthly fee and for overage in color copies (\$1,213.87); #7652 Van Tags/Taxes -

\$155.99 - annual expense; #8290 Misc Exp - Fellowship - \$117.92 - Pizza for Vision Quest lunch. The expenses exceed our income through October by \$18,437.57.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$119,576.90. A large portion of our balance is in the Capital Campaign, Outreach grant funds, and the Liberia Mission Trip.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$6,291.96.

At the November council meeting the council members finalized a 2024 church budget to recommend for your approval. It will be discussed and voted on at our **December 3rd All-Church Potluck Breakfast Meeting**. Please plan to attend and help us decide on our church finances for 2024.

The Fortifying our Foundation for the Future Capital Campaign projects continue. The re-striping of the north parking lot and the sealing and restriping of the west parking lot were done in early November. After the first of the year we will begin the repairs and painting of the sanctuary ceiling and walls. At that point we will then evaluate what money we have left to complete the remaining projects on our list. As chair of the Long Range Planning Committee, I encourage you to continue your commitment in the third year of our 3-year \$300,000 Fortifying our Foundation for the Future Campaign. If you didn't make a pledge but want to help support the building projects, you can do that anytime by indicating on your check, envelope or online gift that it is to support the building projects/capital campaign.

Thanks for your pledge cards that were turned in on Stewardship Sunday. I have 24 pledges to date with an

estimated commitment of \$226,217.00 for 2024. You can turn in your pledge card anytime between now and the end of the year and I'll get it entered into your record.


