

WE GATHER IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD

Tenebrae, a Latin word meaning "**shadows**," has been observed in the church of Jesus Christ since the fourth century. On this Good Friday, we remember the death of Jesus and recall his seven last words on the cross. As we remember the last words, we will extinguish the candles on the communion table, one by one. The gradual extinguishing of the candles will be accompanied by prayers, hymns, choral anthems, and readings from Scripture. Following the final hymn, the Christ candle will be extinguished to signify Christ's death. After a time of silence, depart in quiet to observe the solemn fast of Saturday, in anticipation of the good news of the resurrection.

who has redeemed us from the bondage of sin and given us new freedom.


May we ever be grateful for Jesus Christ and what he has done for us,

Words of Jesus: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." Luke 23:34.



A Responsive Reading:

- ¹ Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions.
- ² Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.
- ³ For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me.
- ⁴ Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment.
- ⁵ Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me.
- ⁶ You desire truth in the inward being; therefore teach me wisdom in my secret heart.

⁷ Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean;

wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Psalm 51:1-14 (NRSV)

We pray, therefore, for people everywhere according to their needs.



A Reading: John 14:1-6 (NRSV)

If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. And you know the way to the place where I am going." Thomas said to him, "Lord, we do not know where you are going. How can we know the way?" Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.

Reading: Mark 3:31-35 (NRSV)

A crowd was sitting around him; and they said to him, "Your mother and your brothers and sisters are outside, asking for you." And he replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

That by God's help they may seek justice and truth and live in peace and concord.



THE FOURTH WORD

Words of Jesus: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27:46



Reading: Psalm 22:1-11 (NRSV)

- ¹ My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
- ²O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night but find no rest.
- ³ Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
- In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- ⁵ To you they cried, and were saved; in you they trusted, and were not put to shame.
- ⁶ But I am a worm, and not human; scorned by others, and despised by the people.
- ⁷ All who see me mock at me; they make mouths at me, they shake their heads:
- 8 "Commit your cause to the Lord; let him deliver let him rescue the one in whom he delights!"
- ⁹ Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast.
- ¹⁰ On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God.
- ¹¹ Do not be far from me, for trouble is near and there is no one to help.

Call to Prayer: Let us pray for all who suffer and are afflicted in body or in mind.

Words of Jesus:

"I am thirsty." John 19:28



Reading: Isaiah 55:1-5 (NRSV)

Lo, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.

² Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy?

Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food.

³ Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live.

I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David.

- ⁴ See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples.
- ⁵ See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you, because of the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.

THE SIXTH WORD

Words of Jesus:

"It is finished." John 19:30



Reading: Luke 13:31-35 (NRSV)

At that very hour some Pharisees came and said to him, "Get away from here, for Herod wants to kill you." ³² He said to them, "Go and tell that fox for me, 'Listen, I am casting out demons and performing cures today and tomorrow, and on the third day I finish my work. ³³ Yet today, tomorrow, and the next day I must be on my way, because it is impossible for a prophet to be killed outside of Jerusalem.' ³⁴ Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it! How often have I desired to gather your children together as a hen gathers her brood under her wings, and you were not willing! ³⁵ See, your house is left to you. And I tell you, you will not see me until the time comes when you say, 'Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord.'"

Call to Prayer: Let us commit ourselves to God, and pray for the grace of a holy life, that, with all who have departed this world and have died in the peace of Christ, and those whose faith is known to God alone, we may be accounted worthy to enter into the fullness of the joy of our Lord, and receive the crown of life in the day of resurrection.

THE SEVENTH WORD

Words of Jesus: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." Luke 23:46

Reading: Luke 2:29-35 (NRSV)

Simeon took Jesus in his arms and praised God, saying,

"Master, now you are dismissing your servant^[a] in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, "This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed—and a sword will pierce your own soul too."

A Prayer: O God of unchangeable power and eternal light: Look favorably on your whole Church, that wonderful and sacred mystery; by the effectual working of your providence, carry out in tranquility the plan of salvation; let the whole world see and know that things which were cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.**
