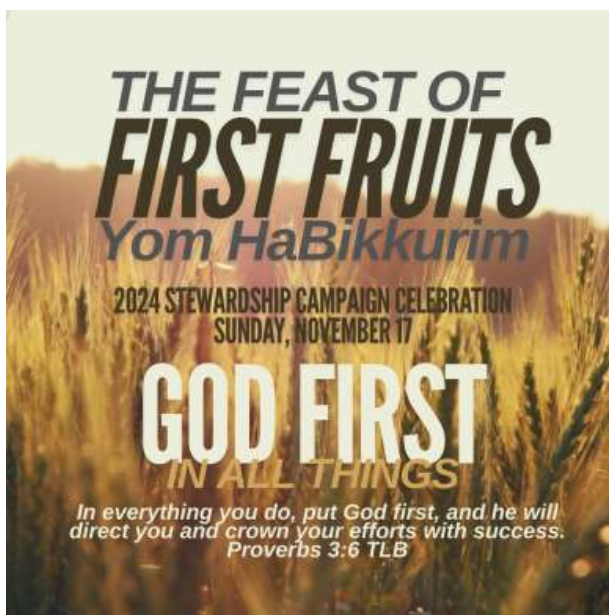
FROM PASTOR’S PEN: “PUTTING GOD FIRST FINANCIALLY”

Life is full of decisions, and one of the most apparent areas where we show our faith to put **GOD FIRST** is in how we manage money. Proverbs 3:6 tells us, *“In everything you do, put **GOD FIRST, and he will direct you and crown your efforts with success.**”* This applies to every facet of our lives, including our finances. As we move toward **Stewardship Sunday on November 17**, we will be prayerfully considering our answer to the *important spiritual growth question: “What percentage of my income is God calling me to give through my local church?”* How we decide to answer this question will have a critical impact on our ministry and mission.

Our stewardship theme this year is **“GOD FIRST.”** To put **GOD FIRST** with our money means trusting Him as our provider and managing what He gives us wisely. One of the main ways we do this is through **tithing** - giving the first ten percent (10%) of our income to the Lord. Tithing shows that we trust God to meet our needs and recognize that everything we have comes from Him. It is a biblical truth taught by God’s people for thousands of years, from the moment Abraham gave a tithe (10%) to God’s priest, Melchizedek (Genesis 14:20). Abraham put **GOD FIRST**.

Being a great money manager honors the Lord. It’s a skill we learn over time and practice. We trust God to provide for our

5. Be Generous: God calls us to share with others. When we give to those in need, we put **GOD FIRST** in love and obedience by becoming a blessing to others.

When we manage the riches God give us by putting **GOD FIRST**, we can trust that He will guide and provide for us. Let's continue to honor God with our money, knowing that He will direct our paths and care for all our needs.

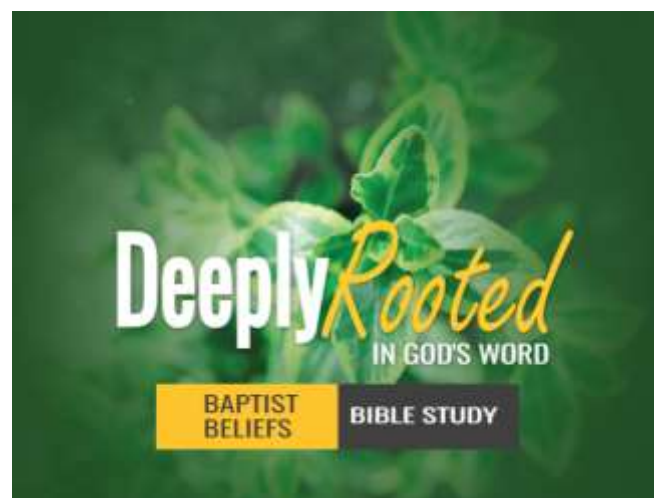

FELLOW CHURCH MEMBER NANCY L SAYLOR

Nancy L. Saylor September 22, 2024 Topeka

Nancy Lou (Edds) Saylor joined God's other angels on Sunday, September 22nd, 2024, following a brief hospitalization. She was the daughter of Clyde Harvey Edds and Barbara Jeanne (Martinson) Edds of Topeka, Kansas.

Born on September 17, 1946, Nancy grew up a few miles southwest of Topeka and attended Topeka public schools. She graduated from Kansas University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing and went on to have a rewarding career in several medical fields. She was Staff Nurse for the Visiting Nurses Association Kansas City Missouri; the Youth Clinic Director for the Johnson County Kansas Health Department; an award-winning pharmaceutical sales representative for Searle Laboratories; a Nurse reviewer of nursing facilities for the Kansas Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services; the School Nurse at Topeka's Seaman High School; a Nurse at the Kansas Association for the Medically Underserved; and Phase I Director of the Midwest Health Disparities Collaborative (Chronic Disease Management Initiative). She filled four different senior management slots at the Kansas Foundation for Medical Care over a period of fourteen years, supporting its mission of guidance in best health practices and quality control for health care organizations, individual physicians, nurses, and other professionals in the medical field.



Nancy's greatest love outside of her family was her dogs. She had at least eight dogs over her lifetime, adopting two and rescuing two others. Every pup added joy to her days and nights, and each one got celebrity treatment. Her other favorites were elephants, horses, rabbits, tennis, and KU basketball...especially KU basketball. She had her picture taken with point guard Devonte' Graham, and with Coach Bill Self twice!

She attended three different NCAA final four games. Hobbies included making personalized greeting cards, rubber stamping, and painting cartoons and messages on small smooth stones, which she left anonymously in random locations around town. Nancy belonged to P.E.O. and a private supper club of four married couples.

Travels to Austria, Switzerland, Liechtenstein, southern France, Monaco, Spain, Portugal, Canada and Mexico were on her list of destinations. But she loved the United States most of all, with trips to Carmel By The Sea, San Francisco, Disney World, New York City, Chicago, and especially the Colorado Rocky Mountains. Nancy met her future husband, Doctor Mark Saylor, in 1976 when, as maid of honor for her best friend Mary Beth Lees and Mark as best man for his brother Steve, the couple were married in Kansas City. Nancy and Mark wed in 1979, celebrated their 45th anniversary on September first of this year, and took in The Jersey Boys musical at the Topeka Civic Theater on Nancy's 78th birthday, September 17th. Brother-in-law Doctor Ed Saylor once told her that when she joined the Saylor family it was the best thing that ever happened to it.

Nancy was preceded in death by her parents Clyde and Barbara Edds. She had six uncles and ten aunts on her maternal and paternal sides of the family, plus numerous cousins, nephews, and nieces, some of whom are also deceased. Nancy's surviving close relatives include her husband Mark, sister Linda Dawson, and her brother and sister-in-law Doctor and Mrs. Breck Edds.

Nancy felt strongly that she wanted no funeral. A celebration of Nancy's life will be held later this year in Topeka, time and place to be announced.

She enjoys movies (especially Hallmark and dramas), enjoys attending festivals and concerts, is energized by going to Yoga, loves reading (mostly nonfiction) and when time permits enjoys doing crafts like painting, diamond art and crocheting. Whew! She's a busy lady!



Tera was born and raised in Topeka in a house at 1st and Kendall. Her parents still own and rent out the house which is right across from Jack and Nelda Janway's house. Her mother, Jeannine, volunteers with our baby closet since she is retired. She worked doing various secretarial/clerical jobs and had several side jobs like Mary Kay Cosmetics and custom nails. Tera's dad, Raymond, was in the army after high school and then worked at Jostens until he passed away in 2008 from pancreatic cancer. Tera's stepdad, Walter, worked as a post office engineer, fixing the machines when they don't work right, until he retired. He also served in the army and was stationed in Germany. This was a meaningful time of his life that he still talks about.

Tera has a stepsister living in Topeka (one nephew) and 2 brothers (one niece), one living in Topeka and the other one has lived all over but is currently living in Winfield.

Tera has two sons. Ethan is 27 and lives in Nebraska and loves to fish. Nathan is 25 and is married to Karlie. They live in Mayetta and just celebrated their one-year anniversary. Nathan works for Overhead Door repairing garage doors and Karlie is an occupational therapist working with kids.

As a child Tera's family attended West Side Christian Church and she remembers also going to her Girl Scout meetings there. She was a Girl Scout for 8 years! For a time her family attended Potwin Presbyterian Church. They also attended St. Phillips Episcopal church where she accepted Christ and was baptized but that church is now closed. She remembers a lot of good experiences in the youth group at St. Phillips including lock-ins and attending camps.

Tera attended Potwin Elementary, Robinson Middle School and graduated from Topeka High where she was on the flag team for three years. She enjoyed spelling when she was in grade school and art was her favorite class as she got older.

Tera works for SLI which is a Topeka organization helping individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. She has worked for them for 25 years, 10 years as a caregiver and currently 15 years as the receptionist. Before going to work for SLI she had various jobs including working at Bobo's drive-in, Montgomery Wards, and even did filing at an optometrist office after school.

Tera shared with me that she loves her church family. She said it has saved her several times over the years. She enjoys making the connections and the friendships!

TREASURER'S REPORT

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for September was \$13,742.08. At the end of nine months our income is \$229,231.29 or 85.45% compared to \$198,681.83 or 74.06% last month. Our % goal for the first nine months is 75.0% of the annual budget so we are exceeding our goal.

Our expenses for September totaled \$19,538.87 and a total for nine months is \$246,336.03 which is 82.84% of our budget.

The difference of income to expenses for the month is -\$5,796.79 and for the year is -\$17,104.74.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$55,172.45. A portion of our checking account, \$49,467.52, is in the Capital Campaign and of that \$6,584.52 is earmarked for missions. We have \$9,448.19 in Outreach funds. The main general fund is -\$1,522.85.

The Benevolent Fund balance is \$537.94.

Council members have been working with me on preparing a 2025 church budget. We will provide you a recommended proposed budget in November and it will be voted on at our December 1st All-Church Breakfast Meeting. Please plan to attend and help us decide on our church finances for 2025.

The Long Range Planning Committee continues to meet to decide on which capital campaign projects to complete. The restriping of the north parking lot should be completed soon if it hasn't already by the time you receive this e-mail. Macy continues to work on preserving the historical room documents. Brice is checking with the piano/organ tuner who will help us determine if we need a humidifier for the organ pipes. We have decided to hold off on landscaping changes until 2025 because of the city's plan for 4th street. Discussion on sound and noise reduction for Fellowship Hall continues. And, the project of new chairs for Holmer Hall remains. As chair of the committee, I encourage you to continue your commitment to our 3-year \$300,000 Fortifying our Foundation for the Future Campaign. We are almost at the end of our 3rd year. Review your pledge when you receive your quarterly giving statement to see what remains with your pledge. And, if you didn't pledge to the campaign, please consider making a year-end gift to help us complete the projects on our list. We have done many projects that you requested more than 3 years ago but there are several remaining. It is important for us to maintain our church property!

Thank you for your continued financial support of our church. Let me know if you have any questions.


