FROM PASTOR'S PEN: "EASTER IS A BIG DEAL"

Jesus said, "No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord.

I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again.

This charge I have received from my Father." John 10:18 (ESV)

Easter is a BIG deal! It is the day we celebrate the single most astonishing event in human history – Jesus' resurrection. The Son of God told his disciples he would go to Jerusalem, be betrayed, suffer and die, *but on the third day he would rise again* (Matthew 16, 17, and 20). His death was guaranteed! But his resurrection was promised too: Jesus would RISE! **AND HE DID!** The Father kept his promise by raising Jesus Christ from the death by the power of the Holy Spirit. That's why we say:

JESUS IS ALIVE! LET'S CELEBRATE!

Can you imagine the shock and awe that gripped the first disciples? The women who came to anoint Jesus' body were met with an earth-shaking reality. Angels declared, "He is not here; He has risen, just as He said" (Matthew 28:6, NIV). What seemed impossible had become reality. Grief was turned into joy, and despair into hope. Truly, *nothing is impossible with God!*

But Easter is not only about what happened in the past; it is about what God is doing now and in the future. Through the resurrection, God initiated a new creation. Just as sin entered the world through Adam and Eve's disobedience, bringing brokenness and death, Jesus reversed the curse through His death and resurrection. (cont.)...

Paul taught us, "For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:22, NIV). Christ's victory signals the dawn of God's renewed world, where every tear will be wiped away (Revelation 21:4).

THE GREAT FIFTY DAYS

The celebration of Easter does not end with our worship service on Sunday morning, April 20. The 50 days from Easter to Pentecost is sometimes called "The Great Fifty Days" or Eastertide.

During the first forty days after Easter, Jesus made countless appearances to his Apostles and followers and give them "convincing proof" that he was raised from the dead. Then, on day 40—Ascension Day (May 29, 2025), Jesus told his disciples to "'stay in the city of Jerusalem until you are clothed with power from on high,'" (Luke 24:49) referring to the promise of the Holy Spirit.

On the fiftieth day, the promised Holy Spirit came with power: ***Pentecost!***

We will celebrate the Great Fifty Days by hearing about Jesus' resurrection, appearances and promises.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER The First Thursday of May

The National Day of Prayer is an annual observance held on the first Thursday of May, inviting people to pray for the nation. It was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of the United States Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman.



Historical Summary

- **1775** – The first Continental Congress called for a National Day of Prayer
- **1863** – Abraham Lincoln called for a day of prayer for the nation.
- **1952** – Congress established NDP as an annual event by a joint resolution, signed into law by President Truman.
- **1988** – The law was amended and signed by President Reagan, designating the NDP as the first Thursday in May.



TREASURER'S REPORT

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for February was \$34,887.12 compared to January of \$22,407.77. For the first two months of 2025 our income total was \$57,294.89 or 20.83% of our adopted budget. Our % goal for two months is 16.67% so we are over our goal! We had generous gifts totaling \$720 to Baby Closet in February.

Our expenses for February totaled \$26,066.98 compared to January of \$52,691.96. For the first two months of 2025 we have an expense total of \$78,808.94 or 24.78% of our budget. Expenses to note: our gas bill for February was down \$500, we spent \$250+ for WWW meals and \$400+ for office consumables.

The difference of income to expenses is -\$21,514.05 compared to the end of January at -\$30,284.19.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$42,925.51. This includes \$6,775.42 in Outreach funds, \$53,278.93 in Capital Campaign, \$602.66 in the Youth Fund and \$1,079.41 in the Benevolent Fund.

We have a new memorial established for Don Johnson that as of this week as I write this article totals \$590.




