

FROM PASTOR'S PEN: "FINDING GOD IN NATURE

"The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands" Psalms 91:1

"I can find God on the golf course, at the lake or in the woods," a man said to a minister. "Why do I need to go to worship?" It's true: You can find God anywhere and everywhere! The psalmist said God left his fingerprints as evidence of his existence - it is this natural revelation of God as the Designer, Architect, and Redeemer that inspires our spirits to search for God out of the orderliness and complexity of the world.

Summer is one of the most beautiful times of year to step outside and marvel at the wonder of God's creation. The trees are full, flowers are in bloom, birds are singing, and the sky seems to stretch endlessly above us. In these quiet, beautiful moments, we are reminded that the natural world is not just something to enjoy—it's something that reveals God.

Here are a few simple ways to find God in nature this summer:

1. Go Outside with Purpose: Take a walk in your garden, neighborhood, a local park, or sit in your backyard. Leave your phone behind and be silent. Breathe deeply and pay attention to what you see, hear, smell, and feel. Ask God to speak to you through His creation.

2. Reflect on God's Character: As you watch the sunrise or sunset, listen to the rustling of leaves, or observe the order and design in a flower or insect, reflect on the attributes of God: His beauty, power, faithfulness, and care.

3. Read Scripture in the Open Air: Bring your Bible with you. Read a psalm (try Psalm 8, 19, 23, 96, or 104) while you sit under



a tree or by a stream. Let God's Word come alive as you sit surrounded by the very creation the psalmist wrote about.

4. Journal or Pray Outdoors: Write a prayer of thanksgiving for what you see and experience. Praise God for the rhythm of the seasons, the variety of life, (Continued on next page)








TREASURER'S REPORT OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Since this newsletter is for June and July, I will provide you a quick financial overview of the April reports and will encourage you to look at the actual financial reports and summaries posted on the bulletin board for May and June after each of the monthly council meetings.

Our income for April was \$16,471.28. For the first four months of 2025 our income total was \$145,676.72 or 52.95% of our approved budget. Our % goal for four months is 33.3% of the annual budget so we are over our goal. Easter was in April and we had a generous offering on Easter. We also received \$300 for children to attend church camp this summer. More camp monies were received in May and will be reflected in the May reports. Thanks to the church for providing funds for kids to attend camp and for individuals who made additional gifts to help. Additional gifts are welcomed.

Our expenses for April totaled \$33,089.30 compared to March of \$41,122.89. For the first four months of 2025 we have an expense total of \$132,765.85 or 41.74% of our budget. We did have several expenses items to note: we had 3 payroll periods fall in the month of July; the gas bill was down by half from the month before due to warmer weather; we had additional expenses for Easter activities; we renewed our licenses for copyright and video; and we made a deposit for our Worship in the Park planned for June.

The difference of income to expenses for April is -\$16,618.02 and for the year is \$12,910.87.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$49,217.30. This includes \$5,673.46 in Outreach funds, \$50,549.03 in Capital Campaign, -\$1,170.24 (increase from last month) in the Youth Fund and \$1,451.34 in the Benevolent Fund.


