#### "Go Smaller to Get Bigger!"

One of the most beautiful sounds I've been hearing around the church lately is this: "I don't know everyone anymore!"

That may sound like a complaint, but I believe it's actually a **celebration**. God is at work in our congregation - drawing new people into our fellowship, stirring hearts, call people to faith, and adding to our numbers just as He did in the first-century.

Remember what happened in Acts 2? After Peter preached at Pentecost, **about 3,000 people were added to the Church in a single day!** That kind of growth is exciting - but also overwhelming. Imagine so many new faces, you would not know what to do at greeting time. How did the early Christians handle such a sudden, Spirit-led surge of new believers and members?

"Every day the early believers continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." — Acts 2:46–47 (NIV)


The early Church grew bigger by getting smaller. While they regularly gathered in large public spaces to praise God ("in



the temple courts"), they also met in homes for Bible studies, food, friendships, accountability, and spiritual growth. The Apostles taught them that gathering once a week in (continued on next page)

(con't first page)...a large crowd was not enough to sustain their faith or help them grow. Every disciple needed a smaller, more personal settings where faith could be lived out in real friendships.


That's exactly why I am encouraging everyone to get into a **Life Group** this fall. God made us for community - intimacy, friendship, and mutual support. The best way to get to know other believers—and grow in your faith - is by committing to Christian intimacy (*in-to-me-see*) and true friendship.

**Life Groups** will be forming after Labor Day. We hope three to six small groups will form with a focus on fostering spiritual growth, developing deep friendships, and encouraging personal transformation in all aspects of our lives.

**Life Groups** will be small in number (typically eight to ten) that meet in a home on any night of the week, three or four times a month. The Bible Study will be video based, and easy to operate. To make Life Groups a success, we will need:


1) **HOST HOMES:** If you want to host a group in your home, please talk to me. You do not need to cook, clean extensively, or have the biggest house. A kitchen table with chairs or a living room with couches and chairs will work.

- 2) **HOSPITALITY**: Are you gifted at making snacks, greeting people and making them feel at ease? Then sign up for hospitality server. You will be matched with a host home and a facilitator.
- 3) **FACILIATATORS**: Three to six persons gifted with teaching and the ability to lead a group discussion from prepared questions. The first six sessions will be led by bestselling Christian Author and Bible Teacher, **John Ortberg**, from his series: "Soul Keeping: Caring for the Most Important Part of You" by HarperChristian Resources.
- 4) **PARTICIPANTS**: We need people to sign up to form a **Life Group**. You will meet with your small group once a week or every other week, depending upon your availability. You will have a workbook and sign up for the group that works best for you and your family.



If you're feeling like you don't know everyone anymore - there is good news! There are new people to meet, and new lives God is transforming in **Life Groups**. Join a group where you can be known, grow in Christ, and walk together with others who can encourage and support you. Let's continue to be friendly, hospitable, and welcoming! Let's be a church where *no one walks alone* — where everyone is welcomed, loved, and known.







# TREASURER'S REPORT

#### **GOD FIRST in ALL THINGS**

Our income for June was \$20,892.55 compared to \$16,045.79 in May. For the first six months of 2025 our income total was \$182,615.06 or 66.38%. Our % goal for six months is 50.0% of the annual budget so we are still over our goal. There is \$1,490 in miscellaneous for the shirts that have



been ordered. There will be a similar expenditure when the shirts are paid. We received an additional \$360 (total of \$2,070) for children to attend church camp. In July we will be receiving our second Topeka Community Foundation distribution. It will be \$3,839.00 from the Vern and Portia Allbert estate.

Our expenses for June totaled \$24,187.72 compared to May of \$21,631.02. For the first six months of 2025 we have an expense total of \$178,613.13 or 56.16% of our budget. Expense to note: Van Insurance – \$543 annual payment.

The difference of income to expenses for June was -\$3,295.17 compared to May of -\$5,585.23 and for the year is \$4,001.93.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$45,699.41. This includes \$6,602.96 in Outreach funds, \$47,677.43 in the Capital Campaign, -\$1,170.24 in the Youth Fund and \$1,862.73 in the Benevolent Fund.

At the July council meeting the council requested the Memorials committee discuss memorial funds for the new refrigerator in the youth room downstairs and the changes in technology for two of the Sunday School rooms upstairs.


## **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**

#### **BACONE COLLEGE CLOSES**

HISTORIC COLLEGE FOUNDED IN 1800s SUFFERS FINANCIAL COLLAPSE DUE TO MISMANAGEMENT

Recently, Bacone College concluded their 145th year ministry in Muskogee, OK. Recent financial hardships were not able to be resolved and a US Bankruptcy judge ordered assets be liquidated to

pay indebtedness. The conclusion of this ministry means that we will no longer be sending mission funding to Bacone. We would ask that your local missions committee be informed of this change and please do not send any additional funds to the Region office earmarked for the ministry at Bacone. In the coming days, the Region will need to decide how to handle Bacone's portion of the Kansas Plan distributions and until those decisions are made, the funding will be held and accounted for. Please continue to pray for students, faculty, staff, and Board members of Bacone College. This has been an important ministry that has impacted many lives. (Reported from the American Baptist Churches of the Central Region—ABCCR)

IN THE FIRST 6 MONTHS OF 2025: Doorstep has spent nearly \$130,000 on Direct Assistance to Clients, provided 1,394 food orders, feeding 3,470 individuals with 78,939 pounds of food, and spent \$27,034 purchasing food to keep our shelves stocked to help our neighbors in need. We have also provided 688 hygiene kits; assisted 83 households who have never received services before, and provided 529 services for linens (blanket, sheets, towels, pillows). Doorstep was built on neighbors helping neighbors and we are a part of a caring and generous community.



Check are required even if you had previous checks or completed this requirement for your employer. **THE TRAINING AND BACKGROUND CHECK ARE FREE.** 






#### **CHURCH DELEGATES NEEDED**
