FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN AND HEART: "GOD'S GLORIOUS HANDIWORK"

For my birthday this year, my children surprised me with mums—actually it wasn't really a surprise because I asked for them and asters. I love mums! Honestly, I love all flowers, but mums hold a special place in my heart. Their rich colors—yellows, oranges, purples, and reds—are like little bursts of praise planted in the soil. Every time I see them, I am reminded that God's creation is not only practical and sustaining, but also breathtakingly beautiful.

Fall flowers, along with the turning leaves, pumpkin patches, and harvest fields, tell us something about God's heart: *God is gloriously generous*! He is not only the Creator, but the Artist. The psalmist prays,

"Blessed be His glorious name forever; may the whole earth be filled with His glory! Amen and Amen!" (Psalm 72:19)








TREASURER'S REPORT

OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for August was \$24,952.48 compared to July of \$18,671.05. For the first eight months of 2025 our income total was \$226,288.59 or 82.25%. Our % goal for eight months is 66.67% of the annual budget so we remain over our budget goal for another month but are slightly behind in covering all the expenses for the year-to-date. We received \$1,000 for #5420 Baby Closet and \$210.00 for #5465 School Supplies.

Our expenses for August totaled \$25,160.52 compared to July of \$24,702.96. For the first eight months of 2025 we have an expense total of \$228,536.00 or 71.86% of our budget. The expenses to note are: #7630 Phones - \$414 for first expense of FINANCES new phone system; #8165 WWW Program - \$263.12; #8468 School Supplies - \$467.64.





The difference of income to expenses for August was -208.04 compared to July of -\$6,031.91 and for the year is -\$2,247.41.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$35,474.47. This includes \$6,654.84 (#1003) Outreach funds; \$48,318.41 (#1006) Capital Campaign; -\$1,104.18 (#1009) Youth Fund; and \$2,266.52 (#1030) Benevolent Fund.

The Memorials committee met recently and have authorized the following memorial expenditures:

- \$389.20 New Refrigerator in the Youth Room: \$25 Susan Carpenter, \$200 -Jeff Powell, \$150 - Kim Maggard, and \$14.20 - Naomi Brooks.
- \$1,178 Technology for the Upstairs Sunday School Rooms: \$1,178 Don Morris
- \$2,512 Router and Assistance: \$1,073.02 Gil McCurdy, \$406.00 Ken Paslay, \$265.00, Marie Merrifield, \$534.15 - Hilda Lundgren, \$200.00 - Helen Farrar, and \$33.83 - Helen Bloom.

We also had a request for kitchen items from the volunteers who worked at our church clean. We recommend they be purchased and that part of Judy Longstaff's memorial fund be used for these items.

WELCOME REVEREND

I tell people I was born at the morgue during a snowstorm, which technically I was. I was born at Dover Air Force Base, which is also known as the military morgue. Gls who die overseas are brought to Dover Air Base first and then are shipped to their hometown. My dad, who was a flight engineer on a C-130 and was at the air base in New York the night Mom went into labor. Dad and the pilot went and cleared the snow from the runway after Dad was notified Mom was in labor and flew back to Dover in the snowstorm. They arrived after visiting hours; however, that did not stop my dad from seeing his newborn daughter. He caused such a ruckus that the nurses let him in to see me.

At the age of nine, while attending church camp, a relationship with Christ began slowly and steadily. Throughout the years, God has been faithful; he has corrected and led the path to Him. Faith in God and His Word has always been the backbone of my everyday life; living a life honoring Christ took time.

Christ was put on the back burner during the years of raising a family and the daily grind of life. While attending church was important, living a life that honored God was not happening; thus, those children currently live the same lifestyle.

Growing up was hard; my father was a non-functioning alcoholic who drank six months out of the year; the other six months, he was sober and the best dad ever. Mom was a woman who didn't know how to be a mom; she wanted to be friends, and I needed a parent. When I was nine, I had the privilege of attending a church camp during the summer. At camp that summer, I made the walk and accepted Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior. My brother is seven years older than I and alternated between our home and our mom's parents' home. By the time he was fifteen, he had been living permanently with our grandparents. Our parents separated when I was twelve and divorced when I was fifteen. Even though Dad was a non-functioning alcoholic, he was what kept me grounded. After the divorce, I went wild. I had my first daughter at fifteen and my second daughter at seventeen, and even though they had the same father, life was not good. At eighteen, I joined the United States Army and was sent off to boot camp two weeks before my nineteenth birthday. My daughters and the military helped to bring my life back on track, as I wanted a better home life for my children than I had, and I wanted them to live out the American dream as healthy, functioning adults. While in the military, I met and married a man and had two more girls. Come to find out, he was already married when we were married, leaving me to raise all four girls alone. My mother's influence on the two older girls has had a negative impact on their lives, and I feel the weight of that guilt. My two younger



daughters are two of the most influential women in the lives of those they encounter. The oldest owns a loose-leaf tea store and contributes to her local community in numerous ways, in addition to being a wife and a wonderful mother to her two daughters. My youngest daughter graduated with dual master's degrees, one in criminal justice and the other in Nursing, thus making her a forensic nurse. She works as an emergency room nurse at the Memphis Veterans Affairs Medical Center (VAMC). She has given me three wonderful grandchildren, one boy and two girls. My grandson has been developmentally disabled since birth and will always require twenty-four-hour care. He is now eighteen years old, and my daughter has been, from the very beginning of his birth until this day, an exceptional mom to him and his two younger sisters. (Continued on next page)

BROWN'S OFFICE HOURS Monday-Tuesdays: 12 PM - 4 PM Wednesdays - Off Thursday-Fridays: 12 PM - 4 PM & By Appointment While raising my daughters, I told myself that if I ever pursued a college degree, I would attend seminary because I wanted to give back to others the way God has and does give to me.

Even with all the mistakes I made by not putting God first, I always knew God was with me. My faith has been my strength throughout the years of struggles, trials, and tribulations. As you can see from my transcripts, I made a slight detour by obtaining my Medical Assistant degree first. However, God had His hand in that; it meant putting me where he wanted me. My children were all grown and moving away from the area, so I had a conversation with God about wanting to move. I was going to apply for jobs everywhere as a Registered Medical Assistant, and wherever he wanted me to go, to ensure that was the only place I received a job offer from. God moved me to Leavenworth, Kansas. I applied to the Leavenworth VAMC but never heard a word from them.

One night, I received a call asking if I was still interested in the job, as it had been months since I applied. I informed them I was, and I received an offer through email. Why is this important? By moving to Kansas, I reconnected with the youngest of my two oldest daughters. She became pregnant in a bad relationship and moved in with me when the baby was one month old. At four months old, she abandoned her little boy in my care. Elijah was born in May of 2017; I had already started the process of pursuing my Master of Divinity in Pastoral Counseling. My first semester was in August 2017, and I worked swing shifts at the Leavenworth VAMC. God took me from that position so I could give Elijah a better home life, into a Monday through Friday position. When Elijah turned eighteen months old, he became my son legally.

God placing me within the walls of a VAMC showed me what my calling truly is: Chaplaincy forwomen. Some women, whether Veterans or civilians, have had a lot of hurt and pain, and some of that from men. I find it hard to open up to male Pastors, Ministers, and Chaplains, and I know that other women do, too. Women Chaplains provide an opportunity not available to men to reach women who have otherwise closed themselves off to God because of men. Men talk to men in their language just as women talk to women in their language. Thus, I will stand in that gap that might not otherwise be filled.

I end this bio with the last thing my dad did for me. He called me on my birthday and told me he was in the hospital. He led me to believe that he was in the hospital due to his alcoholism. While on the phone, Dad gathered all the guys on the floor and had them sing 'Happy Birthday' to me over the phone. Four weeks later, my father went into a coma, and six weeks after that, my dad passed away from lung cancer. For all of my dad's faults, he loved me, and I loved him.

IS GOD CALLING YOU TO BE A DEACON? The

Diaconate is all Deacons, both men and women, called and elected by the Congregation to serve as "servants" in ministries of compassion, spiritual care, and justice. Deacons discern and share the needs, hopes, and concerns of the world with the Church, calling us to



respond in faith and charity. They ensure that the vulnerable, marginalized, suffering, homeless, oppressed, poor, and elderly are heard and cared for. Deacons assist the Minister in public worship, including preparing the worship space, reading Scripture, and supporting Baptism and the Lord's Supper, as well as visitation, grief ministries, and funerals. 




