


NEW CLASS STARTING NOVEMBER 23:

TREASURER'S REPORT

Our income for September was \$10,150.68 compared to \$25,107.48 in August. For the first nine months of 2025 our income total was \$236,594.27 or 86.0%. Our % goal for nine months is 75.0% of the annual budget so we remain over our budget goal for another month!

Our expenses for September totaled \$29,095.79 compared to August of \$25,315.52. For the first nine months of 2025 we have an expense total of \$257,786.79 or 81.05% of our budget. The difference of income to expenses for September was -\$18,945.11 compared to August of -\$208.04 and our deficit for 2025 is -\$21,192.52.



Our checking account balance is \$15,691.33. This includes \$6025.33 (#1003) Outreach funds; \$48,528.82 (#1006) Capital Campaign; \$199.90(#1009) Youth Fund, and \$2,711.52 (#1030) Benevolent Fund.

You should have be receiving your third quarter giving statement. Please let the office or me know if you haven't received it so we can get you one. It will help you as you begin making your decisions for your 2026 giving pledge.

Pastor Ivan is working on 2025-2026 Stewardship Campaign: "FAITHFUL STEWARDS OF GOD'S GRACE." He creates these campaigns each year to help us answer the spiritual question: What percentage of my income is God calling me to give through my local church? Hopefully, you know by now the campaigns emphasis Our Need to Give instead of God or the church's need to receive. Make every effort to be present for Stewardship Sunday, November 23 for worship and our catered celebration lunch (not a potluck). RSVP to the Church Office by Monday, November 17.

The council is currently working on the 2026 budget and we will be recommending a proposed budget for you to vote on at our December 7th All-Church Breakfast Meeting. This is an important meeting where we Elect Officers and Adopt the 2026 Budget. It's critical all members are present. Please plan to attend and help us decide on our church finances for 2026.



Doorstep will receive our assigned households before Thanksgiving, and we'll be preparing their letters, schedules and compiling wish list items for the 822 individuals!

We provide each household Christmas gifts, food, blankets, hygiene items, household items, school supplies & toys for the children, a puzzle and game,

and gift cards. This is a big project, and we cannot do all of this without the help of our Faith Community Mission Members, individuals, and community groups.

Hopefully you know by now, through our newsletter articles, how much need there is in our community. The increased need for food has remained a constant for a year and half now, and our neighbors are struggling to make ends meet, often needing a hand up with bills, or the very least with food to feed their families. Your donations help feed hungry people in Topeka and Shawnee County. Thank you!

In 2025, Doorstep provided 2,297 food orders to make meals for 5,753 individuals with 126,686 pounds of food!



2025 CHRISTMAS BUREAU: The Shawnee County Christmas Bureau is an annual tradition that allows everyone in our community to make the holiday season brighter for our Shawnee County neighbors in need. United Way of Kaw Valley and other community partners connect thousands of individuals and families to a holiday meal and gifts by matching them with agencies or community "adopters."


