OUR CHURCH FINANCES

Our income for October was \$19,901.13 compared to \$10,150.68 in September. For the first ten months of 2025 our income total was \$256,456.48 or 93.22% of our annual budget. Our % goal for ten months is 83.3% so we remain over our budgeted goal for another month!

Our expenses for October totaled \$28,956.92 compared to September of \$28,888.39. For the first ten months of 2025 we have an expense total of \$286,108.19 or 89.96% of our budget. Expenses to note include: Payroll is every two weeks and this month we had three pay periods; #7730 Organ/Piano Maintenance – two times a year and one was this month - \$395.

The difference of income to expenses for October was -\$9,055.79 compared to September of -\$18,737.71 and for the year is -\$29,651.71.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet is \$4,058.80. This includes: -\$53,299.69 in (#1001) main account; \$5,422.11 in (#1003) Outreach funds; \$48,718.82 in (#1006) Capital Campaign; -\$141.32 (#1009) Youth Fund; and \$3,143.52 in (#1030) Benevolent Fund.

I am pleased to report that in our support of the missionaries Joseph-Carrion in the amount of \$100 per month is going well. We currently have in this fund \$818.25.

The Council met on November 18th to finalize our recommendations for the 2026 budget. We encourage you to attend the December 7th All-Church Breakfast Meeting where we will discuss and then vote on the budget and our officers for 2026. I hope you plan to attend. It is important to us to have you help us decide on our church finances for 2026.

Giving envelopes for 2026 will soon be made available. It is essential for us to keep record of your tithes and offerings. For those who give online, you will be assigned a number, but for those of you who write checks or give cash, we

would like you to use an envelope to help us in recording your gifts. We will try to give you the same number that you are using this year. Please let the office know if you do not receive your envelopes or you can talk with Nelda Janway, Nancy Ohse or Nancy Lindberg and we'll get them to you. Let me know if you have any questions.

DID YOU KNOW...



My first class for my Doctor of Ministry in Pastoral Counseling was Foundations for the Doctor of Ministry. In this class, we compared and contrasted the attractional vs. gospel-driven (missional) church. We spent eight weeks comparing and contrasting Billy Hornsby's The Attractional Church and Jared C. Wilson's The Gospel-Driven Church: two passionate authors, two very different visions. Honestly, before this class, I did not know the difference. Here's what I learned and truly made me understand why I am drawn to West Side Baptist Church of Topeka.

Billy Hornsby, co-founder of the Association of Related Churches (ARC), believes the church has grown stale and intimidating. His solution? Become "refreshing, relational, and relevant." Excellent music, welcoming environments, practical messages—make Sunday the best hour of someone's week so they'll want to come back and eventually meet Jesus. Hornsby insists this isn't a compromise; it's removing unnecessary barriers so lost people can hear the gospel.

Hornsby argues that this isn't shallow showmanship—it's a strategic mission. "The attractional church never loses sight of the souls for whom Christ died," he writes, emphasizing outreach to neglected cultures. By nailing the "first impression"—from parking to preaching—churches foster environments where faith renews and the lost wander in. Case in point: ARC plants like Church of the Highlands, which blend excellence with evangelism to draw crowds and spark life change

Jared Wilson, on the other hand, spent a decade inside the attractional church and came out convinced it's broken. His biggest critique (and the part that hit me hardest in class) is this: attractional churches often end up preaching a "feel-good" gospel in which Jesus conforms to man rather than man conforming to Jesus.

When the driving question is "How do we keep people coming back and giving?" the preaching slowly shifts. Sin gets soft-pedaled, repentance becomes optional, and the cross is presented mainly as the solution to sadness, loneliness, or a bad week—rarely as the remedy for rebellion against a holy God. Jesus becomes a life coach who exists to make you happier, rather than the King who calls you to die to self and follow Him. Wilson writes, "What you win them with is what you win them to." Win them with a comfortable, low-commitment experience, and you'll end up with consumers, not disciples.

His alternative: A gospel-driven, missional approach where Sunday equips believers to scatter like salt and light. Worship is for disciples—raw, participatory, gospel-soaked—not polished performances for seekers. Mission flips from "come and see" to "go and tell," measuring fruit by transformed lives, not filled seats.

At the end of the day, Jesus didn't give us a vision statement about weekend attendance goals or worship-set vibes. He gave us a commission: "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20)

That little word "Go" is everything. It's not "build something so attractive that they have no choice but to come," and it's not "wait until the world looks holy enough to deserve the gospel." It's "as you are going"—as you live, work, parent, neighbor, shop, suffer, and celebrate—make disciples. Go therefore and make disciples by being the feet, hands, and love of Christ to all you meet. Thank you, West Side, for being a gospel-driven church that shows the love of Christ to the community. Seeing the community not as "the lost" but as children God created whom He loves, and wants us to love where they are, and He will complete the work!





Pumpkin Squares with Bev. McCurdy


CRUST:

December is Retired Ministers and Missionaries Offering month!

Why should congregations give?

We give to remember and thank the retired clergy and missionaries who have dedicated their lives in service to Christ, the church, and to us. With gift revenue from the RMMO 2024 offering, we distributed 3,331 thank you checks averaging \$174, a modest amount in which the gesture says far more than the dollars. 
