## **FROM PASTOR'S PEN: "A SPIRITUAL ADVENTURE" - 40 DAYS WITH THE LORD IN DESERT PLACES**

Do you want a more intimate relationship with God? Do you want to grow biblically and spiritually? Are you ready for a time of self examination even if it reveals that you have areas in your life to grow, heal, fix, and repent? Are you willing to walk the rough road if it means you become a better person? ***Then the season of Lent is for you!***

The church will enter a period of 40 days and nights where we will spend focused time learning to live like Jesus. It's a journey with Jesus that is not of comfort but of transformation. Just as Jesus spent 40 days in the desert facing the devil in preparation for his public ministry, Lent calls us into our own desert places, where distractions fall away and the voice of God can be heard more clearly. ***It's a time to be Spirit led and fed!***

Like Jesus, we are led by the Spirit into this sacred wilderness not to be abandoned, but to be formed. Lent invites us to let go of things that numb, distract, or consume us so that we can rediscover life in Christ.

It's also a time that we focus on Jesus and the cross. We will hear Jesus' invitation to *take up your cross*:

Then Jesus told his disciples, **"If anyone would**  
come after me, let him deny himself and take up  
**his cross and follow me."** **Matthew 16:24**

And, I hope to host a series of "**Journey with Jesus**" spiritual sessions (like Advent) to help us practice prayer, silence, fasting, and compassion during our Lenten season.




# TREASURER'S REPORT

Our income for December was \$32,491.04 compared to \$31,138.30 in November. For the 2025 year our income total was \$320,262.75 or 116.41% of our budget of \$275,113.00.

Our expenses for December were \$25,899.63 compared to \$22,599.73 in November. For the 2025 year our expenses totaled \$336,837.91 or 105.91% of the budget.

The difference of income to expenses for December was \$6,591.41 compared to November of \$8,538.57. For 2025 we are at -\$16,575.16.

Our checking account balance shown on the balance sheet for 2025 is \$19,367.44. This includes: -\$36,008.27 in (#1001) main account; \$5,041.02 in (#1003) Outreach funds; \$46,292.68 in (#1006) Capital Campaign; \$246.42 (#1009) Youth Fund; and \$3,572.52 in (#1030) Benevolent Fund.

At the December breakfast the congregation recommended an audit be held in 2026. I did some initial research and discussed with the council the difference between a review or an audit and suggested several audit companies. The council approved doing a review this year. I will be bringing bids from several companies and a timeline to the council.

Giving envelopes for 2026 have been distributed. If you did not get envelopes and would like them, please let Nelda Janway or Nancy Ohse or the office know and we'll get a set to you.

Year-end statements have also been distributed or mailed. If you have any questions regarding your statement, please talk with Nancy Lindberg.

Anyone wanting information on how to set up their annual Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) to go towards their 2026 tithe should talk with their investment advisor, attorney or have an initial conversation with Nancy Lindberg.

A full review of our finances for 2025 are in the annual report. I encourage you to get a copy of the report.



# MISSION

Did you know at the back of the sanctuary there are pictures and information about all of our missionaries stationed around the world. I'd like to share with you this month an email from Larry and Becky Stanton who serve in Hungary. You may remember that we hosted a breakfast for them last summer.

*Friends,*

*We'd like to introduce you to a man named Nándor.*

*Nándor lives in northern Serbia, where Larry partners with Pastor Zoltán and the local Baptist church. In the 1990s, during the Serbian war, Nándor served as a radio operator. When the war ended and he returned home, something in him had changed. Like so many who carry invisible wounds, he never quite found his way back to the life he had known. In recent years, Nándor has been scraping by. He has struggled to care for himself and for his home, and his diet has been painfully inadequate. On weekdays, the Red Cross soup kitchen provides him with a small cup of soup and half a bread roll—usually his only meal of the day.*

*Larry first met Nándor while delivering firewood with the church. That simple act of warmth became the beginning of a relationship. Nándor was overjoyed to talk with Larry. He speaks English, and with bright eyes he shared that years ago he used to communicate with people all over the world by radio. These days, he rarely has anyone to talk to. The conversation itself felt like a gift.*

*As trust grew, the church learned more about just how difficult life had become for him. Mónika, one of Larry's ministry partners, offered to begin helping with weekly housekeeping. This practical care has brought immediate and visible change—his home is cleaner, healthier, and more livable. But even more importantly, Nándor himself is changing. He told us that for the past two years, before the church became involved, he felt as though he was "two meters underground"—as if he were already dead. Now, he is attending church. He told Larry that he and God are talking about the future.*

*As Larry said when he was telling me the story, "That hope is so strong." There's a lady from the church who stops by and brings him food from time to time. Larry shared with him that what he recently experienced is God's love—the most powerful thing in the universe.*

*Friends, this is why your partnership matters. Because of you, help arrives not only as firewood or food or housekeeping, but as presence, dignity, conversation, and hope. Together, we are witnessing what happens when someone who has felt buried begins to breathe again.*

*Thank you for walking with us, for caring about people you may never meet, and for being part of God's restoring work in places that are often unseen.*

# Women's Ministry

## Celebrating God's Work Among Us: A Church Health Survey Update

Over the past several weeks, many of you participated in our church health survey. Thank you for taking the time to reflect honestly on your spiritual life and your experience within the church. Your willingness to engage in this process is itself a sign of a healthy, growing community that desires to follow Jesus faithfully.

The purpose of this survey was not to assign grades or to compare ourselves with other churches. Instead, it was designed to help us discern how God is shaping us as disciples—to celebrate areas of strength, to recognize patterns of growth, and to identify places where we can continue to mature together.

What follows is a summary of the results and what they tell us about the overall health of our church.

### How the Survey Was Designed

The survey focused on **four biblical “marks” of a healthy disciple**, each representing a visible outcome of a growing relationship with God:

1. Deep Love of God
2. Life of Obedience
3. Patterns of Sacrifice

### Fruitfulness in the Life of the Disciple

Each mark included **eight questions**, and participants responded using a five-point scale:

- Always (5)
- Almost Always (4)
- Occasionally (3)
- Not Very Often (2)
- Not at All (1)

With 42 participants, the **best possible score for each mark** was **1,680** (40 points per person  $\times$  42 participants). The scores were then averaged to provide a clear snapshot of how consistently these marks are visible in the life of our church.

### The Big Picture: A Healthy and Encouraging Snapshot

Before diving into each mark, it's important to look at the overall results.

All four marks scored between **7.73 and 8.07 out of 10**, indicating a church that is spiritually healthy, engaged, and growing. These are strong results by any measure. Even more encouraging, the majority of responses across all marks fell into the **“Always” and “Almost Always”** categories.

This tells us that the values we talk about—loving God, obeying His Word, living sacrificially, and bearing fruit—are not just ideas. They are realities being lived out in everyday life.

At the same time, the presence of some **“Occasionally”** responses reminds us that discipleship is a lifelong journey. Growth is ongoing, and God is continually shaping us.

### Mark 1: Deep Love of God

#### Average Score: 7.73

When measuring a Christian's relationship with God, a **deep love for God** will be visible in their life. This includes delight in worship, desire for prayer, engagement with Scripture, and affection for God Himself.

The results for Mark 1 show a strong foundation. Most participants indicated that love for God is present **almost always**, with many answering **always**. This reflects a church that genuinely desires to know God and walk closely with Him.

However, Mark 1 also had the widest range of responses, including the highest number of **“Occasionally”** selections among the four marks. This helps explain why its average score was slightly lower than the others.

Rather than being discouraging, this is actually a meaningful insight. Love for God is not static—it must be continually cultivated. Seasons of busyness, stress, or distraction can impact our spiritual rhythms. The data gently reminds us of the importance of prioritizing prayer, worship, and time in God’s Word, both individually and together as a church family.

## **Mark 2: Life of Obedience**

### **Average Score: 8.00**

When measuring a Christian’s relationship with God, a **life of obedience** will be visible through daily choices, moral integrity, and submission to God’s Word.

Mark 2 scored very strongly, with a large concentration of responses in the “**Almost Always**” category and fewer low-frequency responses. This indicates a church body that not only understands God’s commands but is actively seeking to live them out.

Obedience flows naturally from love for God, and these results suggest that faith is being translated into action. Many respondents expressed consistency in aligning their lives with biblical teaching, even when it requires effort or sacrifice.

This is a sign of spiritual maturity and trust in God’s wisdom.

## **Mark 3: Patterns of Sacrifice**

### **Average Score: 8.07 (Highest Overall)**

When measuring a Christian’s relationship with God, **patterns of sacrifice** will be visible through generosity, service, and willingness to put others before self.

Mark 3 received the **highest overall score**, and the data shows strong “Always” and “Almost Always” responses across nearly every question. This points to a church that understands discipleship involves cost—and embraces that calling.

Sacrificial living can take many forms: serving in ministry, giving generously, caring for others, and making time for God’s work even when it’s inconvenient. The survey results suggest that these patterns are deeply embedded in the life of our church.

This is a powerful testimony to God’s work among us and a reflection of hearts shaped by the gospel.

## **Mark 4: Fruitfulness in the Life of the Disciple**

### **Average Score: 8.02**

When measuring a Christian’s relationship with God, **fruitfulness** will be present—spiritual growth, Christlike character, and positive impact on others.

Mark 4 also scored very highly, with consistent responses across questions and relatively few low scores. This indicates that many are seeing tangible evidence of spiritual fruit in their lives.

Fruitfulness is often the result of the other marks working together. When we love God deeply, walk in obedience, and live sacrificially, spiritual fruit naturally follows. The results suggest that this process is actively taking place within our church.

## **What These Results Tell Us**

Taken together, the survey paints a picture of a church that is:

- **Spiritually healthy**
- **Actively growing**
- **Committed to discipleship**

## **Living out its faith in practical ways**

The slight variations between marks are not signs of weakness but opportunities for continued growth. In particular, the results encourage us to keep nurturing our love for God so that everything else continues to flow from that foundation.

## **Moving Forward Together**

We are grateful for what God is doing among us. These results should encourage us, remind us of His faithfulness, and inspire us to continue growing together.

As a church, let us remain committed to loving God deeply, walking obediently, living sacrificially, and bearing much fruit—for His glory and for the good of those around us.

Thank you again for participating and for being part of what God is doing in our church family.






